

Ingrid Bergman cremated; family and friends attend

United Press International, LONDON — Swedish-born ctress Ingrid Bergman was cre-

nated Wednesday in a private uneral ceremony attended only y family and close friends, a uneral home spokesman said. Among those attending serices at the Swedish Church and West London Crematorium vere her four children, Harrod's funeral home said.

Bergman died Sunday on her 67th birthday after an eightvear battle against cancer. A public memorial service

will be held at a later date to allow fans to pay tribute to the three time Oscar-winner. Bergman achieved fame for

her roles in such cinema classics as "Casablanca," "Gas Light" and "Intermezzo.'

In an acting carreer that produced 25 movies, Bergman won Academy Awards for "Gaslight" n 1944, "Anastasia" in 1956 and "Murder on the Orient Express' in 1974. She also won a Tony award for acting on Broadway.
