**Reagan asks for full  
Jordan-West Bank tie**

TEL AVIV, Israel — Presi-  
dent Reagan called for full ties  
between Jordan and the Israeli-  
occupied West Bank in a new  
U.S. effort to solve the Palesti-  
nian problem, Israeli news re-  
ports said Wednesday.

Israel called a special Cabinet  
session for today to discuss  
Reagan's move and said Prime  
Minister Menachem Begin  
would interrupt his vacation to  
attend the meeting, Israel radio  
said. Begin is also scheduled to  
meet Secretary of Defense Cas-  
par Weinberger today.

The new post-Lebanon policy  
was outlined in a Reagan letter  
to Begin delivered by U.S.  
Ambassador Samuel Lewis.

Israel radio reporter Shimon  
Shiffer said the Reagan letter  
called for full ties between Jer-  
dan and the West Bank, which  
Israel captured from Jordan in  
the 1967 Middle East War and  
has occupied since.

The Yedioth Ahrnoth news-  
paper said Jerusalem views such  
a move toward a Palestinian  
state, which Israel opposes, con-  
tending that Jordan is the natu-  
ral Palestinian homeland.

Shiffer said that Israel views a  
possible link-up between Jordan  
and the West Bank as a deviation  
from the U.S.-sponsored Camp  
David accords. Those accords  
call for autonomy for 1.2 million  
Palestinians in the West Bank  
and Gaza Strip.

The extent of the autonomy  
was left open, but negotiations  
between Israel, Egypt and  
United States have been on  
for 15 months.

Israeli Defense Minister  
Sharon and Foreign Minister  
Yitzhak Shamir contend  
Jordan, whose population is  
more than 60 percent Pales-  
tian, is the Palestinian homel-  
and.

receives  
welcome**

ATHENS, Greece — The  
Liberation Organization  
leader Yasser Arafat arrived  
Wednesday to a hero's welcome  
and defiantly claimed his  
rillas had stopped "the  
savage barbarian troops"  
capturing Beirut.

Arafat, who left Beirut  
ship Monday, was welcomed  
the dock at Phaleron by  
Andreas Papandreu and  
he did not consider himself  
feared.

Arafat came ashore at  
Flisvos Marina shortly  
12:15 p.m. (4:15 a.m. C.T.)  
from the white cruise  
Atlantis, which sailed into  
tourist port escorted by sea  
coast guard cutters.
