Tests offer way to skip courses

Undergraduates can test out of a variety of classes through credit by examination, says Dr. John Green, a research psychologist in charge of testing services.

Green said Measurement Research Services offers two different programs in which students can test out of classes. The College-Level Examination Program, which is given on a national level, is offered approximately every three weeks through the Measurement Research Services office at a cost of \$25. The University accepts approximately 20 different CLEP subject examinations including several levels of English, mathematics and history.

Green said CLEP tests cover typical course content that has

been examined and validated by professors in those departments.

Departmental examinations also are offered for students wishing to test out of certain courses. To get approval for taking an examination, students must petition through the dean of their college to the department offering the course.

Green said the most frequently requested departmental examinations are for required political science, mathematics and foreign languages. Cost of the departmental examinations is \$15.

CLEP tests and departmental examinations were designed to help students move through undergraduate work quickly and efficiently, Green said.

Empty spots filling fast

If you can sing or play an instrument — better hurry. Auditions for the four Texas A&M music groups end this week, and the few spots available are filling quickly.

Nearly 300 students will audition for the 80 positions that opened after last year's graduation in the Singing Cadets, the

Women's Chorus, the Reveliers and the Century Singers, music coordinator Robert Boone said. Students interested in the groups should report immediately to 003 MSC and ask for an audition.

Each group has a unique style and history and offers students a chance to get musical experience.

The Singing Cadets is the oldest of the vocal music groups and members have traveled throughout the world for performances.

Robert Boone took over direction of the group in 1960. Since then, the group's tours and per-

formances have increased to 40 or more annually. The Singing Cadets have performed in the White House, on the Ed Sullivan and Mike Douglas television shows and for the Miss Teenage America Pageant.

The Singing Cadets are the only group with a prerequisite of a minimum grade-point ratio of 2.0. Boone said their extensive traveling schedule is responsible for this. Approximately 20 spaces are open in the Singing Cadets this year.

The Women's Chorus, founded in 1979, is the newest vocal music group on campus. The group began with 33 mem-

bers and now has more than 40. The Women's Chorus, under the direction of Patty Fleming, performs a variety of musical styles including classical, pop, swing and show tunes. The chorus is auditioning for 25 women to fill vacant spots.

Unlike the Women's Chorus and the Singing Cadets, the Reveliers is a vocal group open to both men and women. The Reveliers is a vocal ensemble, which features jazz and swing tunes.

From their beginning in 1974, the Reveliers have limited their membership to 12 singers and four instrumentalists. Robert Boone said, this group was the hardest hit by graduation as it was searching for new members.

The group now has only five vocalists and two instrumentalists. The Reveliers entertains at banquets, conventions, campus sponsored events and several out-of-town activities.

The Century Singers started in 1971 as the New Trad Singers and was renamed in 1976 to commemorate Texas A&M centennial. The group averages 60 members a year and is looking for 20 singers this season.

The Century Singers perform throughout the state, singing classical, popular and show tunes. The Century Singers have performed with the San Antonio Symphony Orchestra and in a classical workshop with opera star Ellen Lang.
