IRS layoffs begin Tuesday for 5,000

United Press International The Internal Revenue Service will lay off 24 percent of its 5,818 employees in Texas effective Tuesday.

The layoff is part of the nationwide layoff which was forced by President Reagan's veto of the supplemental spending bill.

Officials at the tax agency said the unpaid furloughs were announced to employees last Friday in individual letters or in personal visits by managers, and will be indefinite, pending Reagan signing a bill appropriating funds for federal agencies or Congress overruling the veto.

In the Dallas-Fort Worth office, the layoff included 1,600 employees. The Washington said 19,000, 88,000 employees nationwide will be laid off.

Peggy Moore, spokeswoman for the Dallas office, said furloughs will hinder locations, primarily in the responsible for tax collection, criminal investigation, employee plans and exemptions. Only "skeleton" staff will remain.

"For example, in the investigation division, our investigators actively involved in a trial in process will not be loughed," she said.

Reagan, in announcing the veto last week, said the bill approved by Congress in August exceeded his spending limits by \$1 billion.

The federal Office of Personnel Management said layoffs would be required between Tuesday and Sept. 13.

Moore said the layoff is not a surprise.

"We knew, with the supplemental appropriations not being passed, that they were going to run out," she said.

"People who owe the taxes should still pay their taxes. It's still accruing, and taxes are due even if it comes around to collect the money," she said.

Van Riddel, spokesman for the National Treasury Employees Union which represents IRS employees, accused the IRS of a power play, for which federal employees are being made to suffer.

"It's very demoralizing federal employee with a right to be treated like a prisoner in the system," she said.

Now you know

United Press International Boston residents were told Jan. 9 when they felt the tremors of a distant earthquake originating hundreds of miles away in New Brunswick, N.J. It registered 5.9 on the Richter scale and seismologists certain nothing stronger had occurred in the northeast in decades.

Why it hit the northeast is what puzzles them. A report in the September issue of Science Digest magazine explains that earthquakes in the West are linked to activity along the San Andreas fault which runs Pacific and North American tectonic plates about each other, shifting, settling and rubbing against each other to cause quakes. But the East is solidly fixed on the North American plate.

"It's much harder to figure out why earthquakes happen in the eastern part of the country," says John Ebel, of the U.S. Geological Survey at Boston College. "We're 10 to 20 years behind California in research."

The most popular theory is that the East coast quakes are the result of a rebound theory which says that the Northeast is still recovering from the last ice age. Ice has obviously receded, but the ground is still springing back and cracking. Thus quakes
