

2 children killed, 1 hurt as preacher drives car into group

SAN FRANCISCO—A street preacher, taunted by a band of teenagers, got in his car and drove it into a group of pedes-trians, smashing two children to death, and critically injuring

another The driver was beaten mercilessly by witnesses of the bloody incident late Friday night. He was rescued by a nearby storekeeper who used a gun to hold off an angry crowd, and then jailed on murder charges.

Police said the mother of one of the dead youngsters, a boy about 3 or 4, had taken the other victim, a girl about the same age, to the circus with her son.

"I was just trying to do a good deed," said the sobbing woman at the scene.

The coroner's office said it was unable to identify the bodies because they had been crushed so severely when the automobile smashed the children against the wall of a building.

The boy was believed to be Lamont Metoyer, and the girl Tiffany Sommers. The injured child was identified as 18month-old Griffin Tamaris

Police said the Tamaris child's mother, Brenda, jumped to safety, but the infant suffered severe injuries and remained in critical condition Saturday.

Blood was spattered for several yards, and the stucco and wood wall was splintered and smeared with flesh.

The driver was identified as William Daguman, 23, of San Francisco.




