Chagra evidence reported

SAN ANTONIO - Elmer Chagra admitted that he shot the assassin of Judge John Wood, a Dallas television station reported.

Tuesday WFAA-TV reported unnamed sources. Mrs. Chagra sent a letter of the conspiracy late last year to Mrs. Wood. Mrs. Chagra admitted she made a \$20,000 payoff to the assassin of the station said.

Mrs. Wood refused to firm she had received any from Mrs. Chagra. Federal authorities involved in the investigation also would not confirm the existence of a letter.

Wood was shot outside San Antonio townhouse in 1979. Chagra was scheduled to appear in Wood's court on charges and subsequently convicted of drug smuggling and continuous criminal activity.

Chagra, his wife, his brother Joe, convicted hit man Charles Harrelson, and his wife Julie are all charged with conspiracy to assassinate Wood.

A trial has been set for Sept. 28. Motions to have the case moved from San Antonio, to suppress evidence of a recorded conversation of the defendants by federal agents and to allow the defendants to be tried separately were refused by federal Judge Robert S. Sions.

Three ex-players sue Cowboys for injuries

DALLAS - Dallas Cowboys guard — are suing the team for one million dollars each because of lasting injuries they claimed were caused in games during the 1960s and 1970s.

They allege team physicians knew the medical implications of their injuries but failed to relay them to the players.
