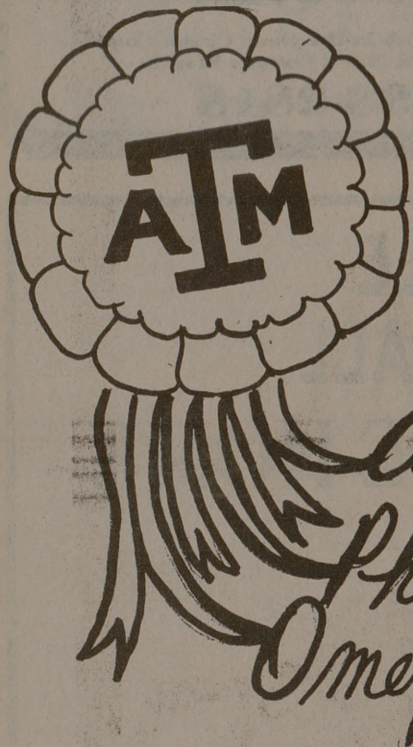

Toxic waste site raises protests in Bay City

BAY CITY — Thirteen-month-old Ruth Rogers clutched a sign Saturday which read "What about me, don't you care?" as her father carried her around the Matagorda County courthouse grounds in protest of a proposed toxic waste landfill site.

The child was one of about 150 people who showed their opposition to a county site being turned into a waste dumping area by Chemical Waste Management Inc. of Illinois.

The CWM holds an option on 950 acres of prime farmland seven miles south of Bay City, Matagorda County. Bay City Mayor Glen Yon said at the rally that city officials had already passed a resolution discouraging the dump site. "This is prime farmland the threat exists of ground contamination," he said. "This land was taken from cultural use and should be used productively for the benefit of our citizens."
