economics from other majors when they find they will be taking courses in business, law, and finance. The wide range of careers also attracts students, he said.

A lack of graduates to fill jobs is not the only problem facing the agriculture industry.

Increasing numbers of students from urban areas, who don't have first-hand knowledge of farms and ranches, are entering agriculture. About 45 percent of agriculture majors at A&M are from urban back-grounds, Suter said.

Stockard, who supervises the hiring of county extension agents, said agriculture experience doesn't assure an applicant a job, but the extension service does require agents to have some experience with agriculture, either before, during, or after college. Agents have to be able to relate to agriculture producers in their own terms, not with textbook words, he said.

However, many jobs related to agriculture don't require prior experience on the farm or ranch. Cordy Carrizalez, a sophomore wildlife and fisheries ma-
