

He said the jurors who heard his case deserved the "Congressional Medal of Honor" for not bowing to public pressure and finding him guilty.

Admitting he is disturbed by the public uproar over the jury's verdict, Hinckley said it demonstrates "the vindictive nature of many Americans.'

"I can only respond with a shake of my head and the wish that society will someday show some compassion for its disturbed outcasts," he wrote. In his letter, Hinckley also dis-
