House debates illegal alien bill

WASHINGTON — Members of the House Judiciary Committee generally support a bill designed to stem the flow of illegal aliens into the country, but a stack of amendments they offered Wednesday could hurt its chances of passage.

Committee members said they were ready to offer amendments aimed at key provisions they do not like.

Major changes in a bill already passed by the Senate could make it impossible for Congress to reach a compromise before the lawmakers go home for the November elections.

The bill, as approved by the Senate, seeks to slow illegal immigration by imposing penalties on employers who knowingly hire illegal aliens.

No amendments were offered to the bill when the committee first took it up Tuesday, but Chairman Peter Rodino, D-N.J., was the first to say he would propose changes to protect employers who hire illegal aliens in good faith.

The bill also would give permanent residency to millions of illegal aliens who were in the U.S. prior to Jan. 1, 1978, and temporary residence to those who came before Jan. 1, 1980.

Rodino said the bill would close a "glaring void" in existing immigration law — "the failure to control illegal immigration by imposing sanctions on em-

ployers who knowingly hire them."

While the hiring provisions were opposed by some members as putting an unfair burden on employers, Hispanic and other rights groups opposed it for another reason.

Rep. Don Edwards, D-Cal., who expressed the position taken by the Hispanic group, said such sanctions would hurt employers to discriminate against jobseekers who do not look Anglo-American.

Joaquin Avila, president of the Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund, said many aliens would have to come forward because they might have difficulty proving they were in the United States prior to the cutoff dates.

"Some will have devoted their lives to eradicating such proof, fear it would lead to deportation," he said in commenting on the bill.

Rep. Harold Sawyer, Mich., one of those who opposed amnesty, said the number of illegal aliens in the country had been estimated at from 1 million to 12 million. To determine who could stay would be almost impossible task, he gestured.

Several members urged the bill be put off until next year.

"It doesn't have to be steaming down the track at miles per hour," said Rep. Lucia Schroeder, D-Colo.

August factory production falls

WASHINGTON — The nation's recession-stricken factory production was cut another 0.5 percent in August, erasing a slight improvement made in July, the Federal Reserve Board said Wednesday.

The August decline in industrial production was the 11th monthly setback for factories and factory workers in the past 13 months and raised new doubts that the nation's manufacturers are about to experience an economic recovery.

A revision turned July's previously reported decline into a 0.1 percent gain. Only July and February have shown any interruption in the recession's trend of declines that began in August of last year.

The August production report showed the auto industry reduced its assembly rate more than 16 percent to an annual rate of 5.5 million units.

Business equipment output dropped 1.4 percent farther in August, the Fed said, and has now dropped 18 percent since the recession began.

The Fed said the output of consumer goods dropped 1.2 percent in August, which is especially significant since that category had shown some growth for the previous two months and was expected to benefit from the July tax cut.

The industrial production index was 138 in August, compared to a base of 100 in 1947.

The only major categories to show any improvement were those for defense and space equipment, with output up 0.2 percent, and construction, up 0.2 percent, the report said.

Factory production accounted for nearly a third of the value added by the goods and services produced by the American economy but has experienced the biggest portion of recession's setbacks while the services sector from fast food restaurants to insurance companies, has been as significantly affected.

At the beginning of the recession, the Commerce Department reported retail sales had declined 0.9 percent in August, despite the economists' expectation that the July tax cut would lead to more consumer spending.

Beauty queen had cosmetic surgery

DALLAS — New Miss America Debra Sue Maffett, who had failed in 12 attempts to win a major pageant in Texas, underwent extensive cosmetic surgery before competing in California, a Dallas newspaper reported Wednesday.

But the beauty queen's mother, who lives in Cut and Shoot, said her daughter underwent nose surgery to correct a deviated septum in 1978.

State pageant officials said Maffett had the "California look" she won her the Miss California and Miss America titles.

Maffett, 25, did not make her surgery public but pageant officials said cosmetic surgery is against the rules of the Miss America contest.
