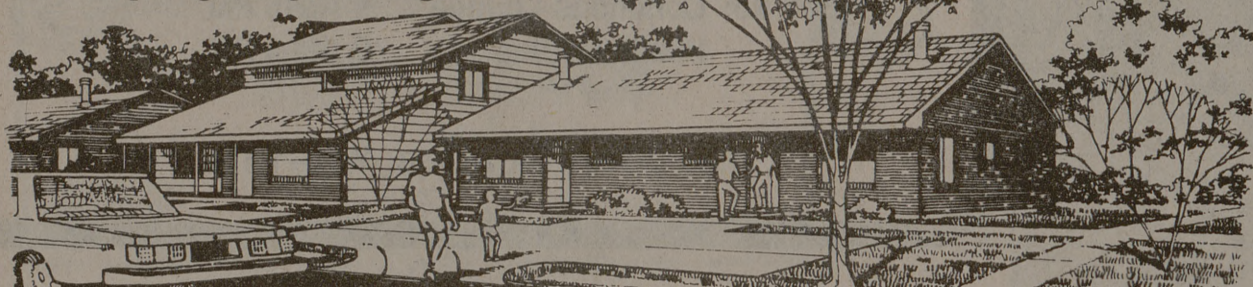

With a little more research, parents may hope their kids are born with buckets of something called PDH.

PDH — pyruvate dehydrogenase — is a simple compound of enzyme that may contain the key to learning. University of California researchers at Irvine believe that PDH enhances the transmission of nerve and brain signals and thus may be critical in the learning phenomenon.

As a neural impulse travels from nerve cell to nerve cell, it leaps across a gap or synapses. To execute its jump, the impulse needs help from substances inside the nerve cells.

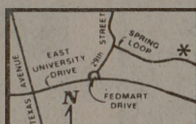

Patients are offered new hearts, new hope

WASHINGTON — It has been nearly 15 years since the first human heart transplant was performed. After years of disappointing results, a leading surgeon says, the operation now has a definite role in the therapy

of people dying of heart disease. Dr. Bruce A. Reitz, who recently moved to Johns Hopkins University from Stanford University, said the development of a drug called cyclosporin A that helps ward off heart rejection is making the picture even

brighter. But even before that drug became available, Reitz said overall patient survival for heart transplant recipients was 65 percent after one year and about 45 percent after five years.

"Survival statistics in themselves do not fully reflect the benefits derived since the quality of life has been good to excellent for a substantial period of time in most longterm survivors. Reitz said in a report in the Sept. 10 issue of the Journal of the American Medical Association. He said late complications after the heart transplant include an increase in the risk of cancer and the development of arterial disease with the transplanted heart.

Dr. Christiaan Barnard performed the first heart transplant in South Africa in 1967 and within a year, more than 140 such operations had been performed around the world.

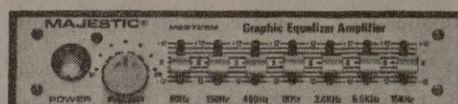
"Early widespread enthusiasm was inappropriate," Reitz said. "Disappointing results led to an equally inappropriate pessimistic view. He said improvements have been made in selecting transplant patients, in detecting and dealing with the body's natural attempt to reject the foreign heart and treatment of other complications.

Reitz said the more recent results "give cardiac transplantation a definite role in the therapy of selected groups of patients who are terminally ill from cardiac disease."

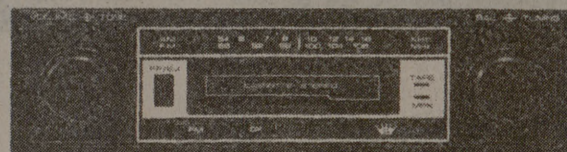
