Chrysler nears black

HOUSTON — If the economy improves slightly, Chrysler Corporation will remain in the black for the third consecutive quarter this year for the first time in five years, Chrysler Chairman Lee Iacocca predicted.
"We could be in the black for the full year if the economy picks up just a little," Iacocca said Wednesday, during a news

conference to preview its new model cars and trucks. Chrysler brought its 1983 models to Texas to begin building business in the Sunbelt, Iacocca said.
He said Chrysler has built up more than \$1 billion in cash and marketable securities — more than it's ever accumulated before.
"As I've said, we don't have to prove anything to anybody any more," Iacocca said. "Against

the odds, against record-high interest rates, record high unemployment, a three-and-a-half year depression in car sales and a national recession that's the worst in 50 years, we've passed the test."

"Chrysler is ready to go. Unfortunately the economy is not. Interest rates are still too high, unemployment is still too high and the rate of bankruptcies is still too high," Iacocca said.

Beirut gets Marines

WASHINGTON — This weekend 800 U.S. Marines will land in Beirut and remain for an indefinite period with French and Italian troops to help restore Lebanese authority over the war devastated city, the Pentagon said Thursday.

Another 1,000 Marines will stay aboard five amphibious ships off the Lebanese coast as a reserve force that can be called on to assist the Marines ashore, Pentagon spokesman Henry Catto said.

The size of the Marine land-

ing force won't change from the one that entered Beirut Aug. 25 and stayed until Sept. 10, but the French and Italians will increase their numbers to about 1,100 each, Catto said. No reason was given for the decision to increase the size of the French and Italian contingents.

The landing will bring the number of troops ashore in the multinational force to about 3,000 men.

The troops, called an "interposition force," would not be stationed between two hostile forces, Catto said.

"We are interposing ourselves in the political situation in Lebanon," he said.

The ships carrying the Marines were positioned Thursday night to land a force if ordered, but a Pentagon official said it was highly unlikely they would go into Beirut before the weekend.

Details of the multinational force's dispersion once they get into Beirut have not been arranged by the coordinating committee of ambassadors from the three countries and Lebanon, Catto said.
