"Although it is generally agreed the video display terminal is not a major source of radia-tion for the user," the doctors wrote, "field surveys of older color television sets have indicated 1.33 to 16.2 percent of receivers at some surface point exceed 0.5 milliroentgens per hour, which is the limit for emission set by the Food and Drug Administration Bureau Radiologic Health."
