WASHINGTON — The rate at which women are getting ahead in banking is increasing, a new study shows.

A 1982 report by the American Bankers Association on the nation's 15 largest banks shows 59,281 women hold jobs in the officials and managers category, or 39.5 percent of the 49,986 people in such positions. The statistics were filed with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

The comparable sampling last year showed 37.8 percent of officials and managers were women. The banks questioned in the study employ about half of the nation's banking employees.

The study also showed continuing gains in advancement of minorities to managerial jobs, from 12.8 in 1981 to 13.4 this year.

the job and I took it.
"This is not like being commandant. This is not a fun job. It's a negative-type job. If you help a student — maybe jumpstart his car — he may thank the officer, but that's all. You never hear from them again. But if you write someone a ticket, you get all kinds of obscene letters and phone calls."

But Parsons complimented the overall behavior of Texas A&M students.
"They're basically good kids," he said. "We don't have any trouble with them — except parking. The people we apprehend for thefts and vandalizing are rarely students."
"Vell Practice is a good example. With that many people in one place, it's amazing that we don't need any police. And we really don't need them. Occa-

sionally there's someone who's had too much to drink, but the other students take care of him."
Following his resignation, Parsons and his wife will return to Louisiana, where he was born.
"We bought a house on Toledo Bend," he said. "It's the largest man-made lake in the nation. It's a waterfront lot. We're going to do a lot of fishing, travel some and look after my mom and dad who live near there."

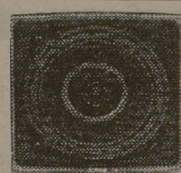

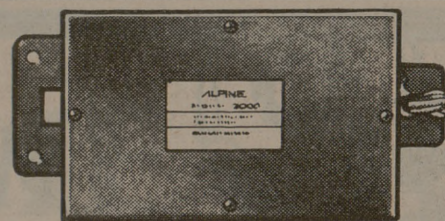

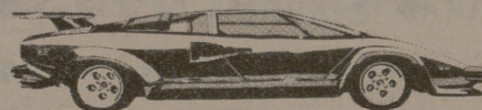
