
## Now you know

United Press International WASHINGTON — The rate at which women are getting ahead in banking is increasing, a new study shows.

A 1982 report by the American Bankers Association on the nation's 15 largest banks shows 59,281 women hold jobs in the officials and managers category, or 39.5 percent of the .49,986 people in such positions. The statistics were filed with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

last year showed 37.8 percent of officials and managers were women. The banks questioned in the study employ about half of the nation's banking employes.

The study also showed continuing gains in advancement of. minorities to managerial jobs, from 12.8 in 1981 to 13.4 this The comparable sampling year.
