

Tea bags head for Washington

United Press International NASHVILLE, Tenn. — "Tea-ed off" radio listeners across the country are shipping hundreds of dried-out tea bags to leaders in the U.S. House and Senate in protest of high taxes and government spending.

The "Great American Tea-A-Thon," as the grassroots move-ment has been dubbed, was launched last Wednesday when a woman in Bastrop, Texas, tele-phoned "The Bill Steensland Show" on Nashville's WLAC

"She was fed up with tax, tax, tax, spend, spend, spend," Steensland said Tuesday. The woman vowed to mail a symbolic tea bag to her representatives in Washington. Instead, Steensland suggested she send just two — one to Senate Majority Leader Ho-

ward Baker and the other to House Speaker Thomas "Tip" O'Neill. Within an hour the phones were buzzing with people across the country pledging to send tea bags of their own.

An out-of-work coal miner said he'd send 55 bags, and challenged other coal miners to do the same. Another man said he
