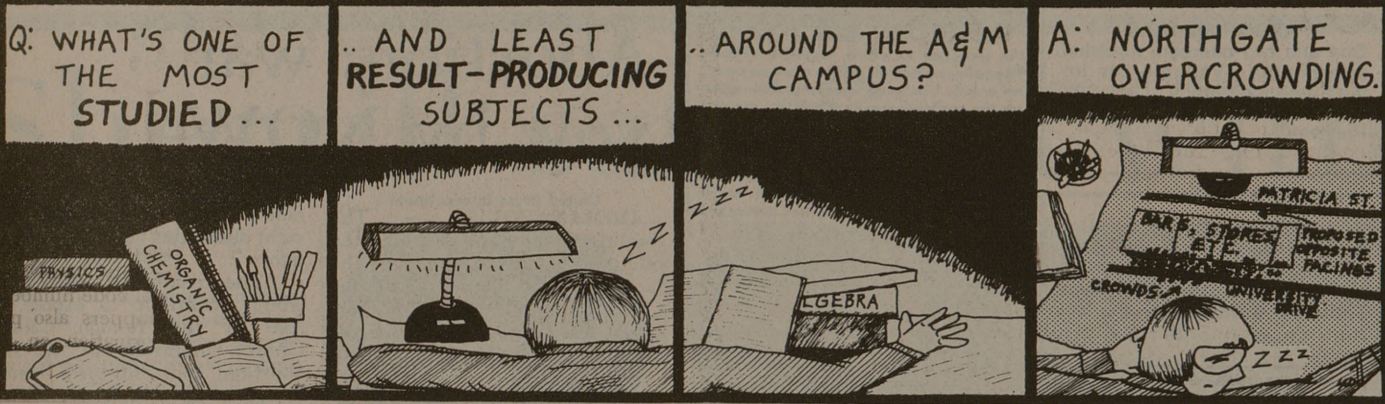

Police capture fleeing suspect

DALLAS — Police Monday were holding a former convict who shot at a policeman with the officer's weapon, then robbed, abducted and later released an elderly woman during a bizarre 15-hour rampage.

Clinton Jones, 25, was captured late Sunday in the attic crawl space of his apartment, police said. Jones was being held in lieu of \$100,000 bond on a charge of attempted capital murder.

Police said the incident began Sunday morning when officer M. Chavarie approached a suspect, and the suspect fled.

Chavarie said he chased the suspect, whose car crashed through a service station garage door. The man then fled on foot.

As Chavarie closed on the suspect with his revolver drawn, the suspect spun around and aimed a

small gun at him, said Chevarie. The man then took Chavarie's revolver. When the officer tried to flee he heard a shot.

Later, Mrs. James S. Miller, 75, was confronted by a man at her home.

She said the gunman shaved off his moustache and beard, then stripped and put on a girdle, a blue dress and white shoes.

The man then ordered her into her car, Miller said. They drove to a shopping center, where the suspect released her unharmed.

"I asked him to let me out somewhere where I could use a phone to call someone to come get me," Miller said. "He did. He said he would call in a few hours to let me know where I could pick up my car.

In the man's apartment, police said they found the officer's .38-caliber revolver, a dress and keys to the woman's car.

Testing shows teacher stress

NEW ORLEANS — Violence, noise and a heavy workload are among factors that lead to stress, burnout and job dissatisfaction among school teachers, according to a test developed by two college professors.

The "teacher stress scale" is believed to be the first test to measure stress levels among school instructors. It was developed by Elaine G. Wangberg, associate professor of curriculum and instruction at the University of New Orleans, and Justin Levitov, assistant professor of education at Loyola University.

Results of stress forms completed by 397 public school teachers in Orleans and Jefferson parishes showed elementary teachers perceive less stress in

their overall teaching environment than their secondary school counterparts.

The tests showed that heavy workload was a primary stress factor for elementary school teachers, while high noise levels, an unpleasant environment and campus violence were top areas of stress for secondary school instructors.

The scale measures a teacher's perception of the job through a series of 75 questions. Wangberg and Levitov, stress management consultants, said the test is the first to specifically apply to educational settings.

Wangberg added that the scale could lead to improvements in working conditions, professional status, compensation and public support for teachers.
