

Chamber head: Economy better

NORFOLK, Va. — Sounding the same themes as much of the Reagan administration and the business community, the president of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce says the economy is on its way out of recession.

"As the (stock) market broke 1,000, I think this shows that quite a lot of businessmen not only believe in a recovery, but they believe strong enough to bet money on it," said Paul Thayer, who was elected in April as president of the 250,000-member Chamber.

Thayer said trade restrictions

in the United States and abroad should be changed so American businesses can market products overseas as easily as foreign manufacturers can market their products here.

"It's ridiculous for us to lie on our backs with a sign saying 'Whatever you want to sell, bring it,' and then for us to be stiff-armed by our trading partners," he said.

Thayer, chief executive officer and chairman of The LTV Corp., a Dallas conglomerate, said business communities have to become more involved in politics and help elect "pro-business" candidates.

Columbia astronauts begin flight simulation

SPACE CENTER, Houston — The four astronauts who will fly the space shuttle Columbia on its fifth mission were scheduled to climb into land-based simulators Wednesday to begin a 56-hour "dry-run" of their flight.

"It will be just as if they were in the spacecraft except they are here on Earth," said Johnson Space Center spokesman Steve Nesbitt.

The 56-hour simulation is designed to prepare mission commander Vance Brand and crew members Bob Overmyer, Joe Allen and Bill Lenoir for Col-

umbia's first operational mission, which is scheduled for launch Nov. 11.

"The crew will be in simulators and mission control will be fully staffed," Nesbitt said. "There will be simulated problems ... and we'll attempt to follow the time line of the mission and accomplish the objectives of (that portion) of the mission."

The most important objective of the Columbia's next voyage is the launching of two satellites from the shuttle's payload bay, Telesat Canada and Satellite Business Systems of Virginia, NASA's first paying customers, have paid \$10 million for the de-

ployment of two commu-

nications satellites from the shuttle. "We will have the (SBS) in Wash., D.C. and Telesat at Kennedy Space Center as if this were a real flight and we were playing their payloads," Nesbitt said.

The simulation would be like the real flight except the astronauts will be allowed to leave the simulators to sleep. Mission control, however, will operate around the clock.

The three-day simulation flight of Columbia is scheduled to end at 4 p.m. Friday.
