A&M Greek area provides continuity

The Greek Village on Athens Drive in College Station provides more continuity and allows more effective interaction between sororities, an adviser for

the Zeta Tau Alpha sorority says.

Judy Richards said the idea for Greek Village was started about five years ago when a representative of the Don Marcal Co. development firm proposed the idea to the College Station Panhellenic Association. The land was owned by the company and was zoned for multi-family dwellings.

Construction on the houses in the area began about four

years ago and the first house was completed in August 1979.

The newest house, owned by the Delta Zeta sorority, is under construction, but members already have moved into the house, said Judy Gortney, alumni adviser for the Delta Zeta sorority.

Eight of the nine sororities in the College Station area have houses in the Greek Village. The ninth house will be completed within the next few years, Richards said. She said the houses range in price from \$500,000 to \$600,000 each and have 10,000 to 13,000 square feet of floor space.

The cost per square foot of the houses is less than most single-family houses, Richards said.

Each house has a different floor plan. Some have suite-type bedrooms with a bathroom shared by two suites; others have a community bathroom at one end of the hall.

The Greek Village houses also have study areas, parking, ceiling fans and phones in each room. The houses have large main kitchens — complete with cooks and a maid — and a mini-kitchen for sorority members use, Gortney said.

Sorority members who live in the houses pay about \$1,400 per semester for room and board, Richards said.


