# Nuke mind stress faces court ruling

WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court agreed Monday to weigh a dispute raised by the Three Mile Island nuclear accident to determine whether "psychological stress" on neighbors should be evaluated before restarting an undamaged unit. Next year justices will review a ruling that for the first time would make the Nuclear Regulatory Commission consider psychological effects before permitting a nuclear plant to operate.

The nation's worst nuclear accident at the plant in Middletown, Pa., crippled TMI's No. 2 unit in March 1979, spreading radiation and spurring a temporary evacuation of pregnant women and preschool children within a five-mile radius of the

plant. Its twin reactor, No. 1, was not damaged, but has been in cold shutdown ever since.

General Public Utilities, the plant's owner, is seeking permission to restart the No. 1 unit, but has encountered strong community opposition.

One group, People Against Nuclear Energy, claim residents would suffer "severe psychological stress" if the undamaged unit is restarted.

It claims the accident created intense anxiety, tension, and fear among residents, accompanied by physical disorders such as skin rashes, aggravated ulcers and skeletal and muscular problems.

The NRC at first refused to consider the residents' complaints of mental distress. But the U.S. Circuit Court of

Appeals in Washington ruled otherwise.

The appeals court ruled that the National Environmental Policy Act requires the NRC to look not only at effects on physical health, but also on "psychological health," including "post-traumatic anxieties caused by fears of recurring catastrophe."

Reaction to the ruling was fierce. Judge Malcolm Wilkes dissented from the decision and warned it could result in "compulsory paralysis of nuclear power."

On appeal to the Supreme Court, the government's lawyers complained the ruling wrong turns an environmental law into one that deals with human emotions.

In a separate appeal, TMI's owner contended the ruling not only could block the restart of its reactor, but also could let public fears about nuclear energy stand in the way of nuclear plant licenses across the country.

## Economy recovery 'started'

WASHINGTON — U.S. Treasury Secretary Donald Regan said Monday the United States is in the initial stages of economic recovery and suggested an examination of Social Security to make it solvent.

"I think we are in the early stages of recovery," Regan said in an interview on the ABC television program, "Good Morning America."

Regan said the administration's economic policies are working. "Those of us who are employed are indeed much better off," he said.

The secretary said even if Democrats fare well in the congressional elections today, the administration will not change its basic economic programs.

"I think our economic policies are correct," Regan said. But, Regan said something has to be done with Social Security because more money is going out to beneficiaries than is coming in from Social Security taxes. He offered no specific suggestions on how to deal with the imbalance.

Democrats have accused President Reagan of planning to slash Social Security benefits after the election. The president has denied any such plans, saying he would protect the Social Security program for those who depend on it.

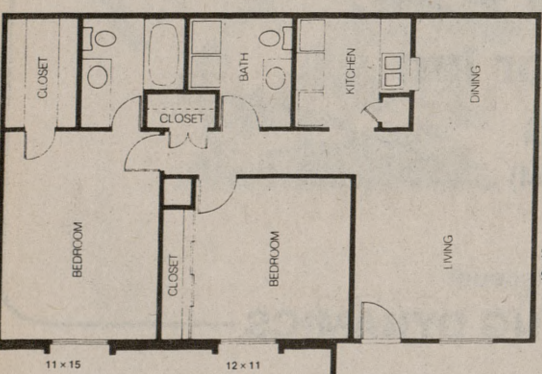
