



Pulitzer trial surprise heard

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. — Testimony in the divorce trial of publishing heir Peter Pulitzer and his wife Roxanne ended sensationally with a surprise: Roxanne testified she saw Mrs. Pulitzer in bed with wealthy socialite queline Kimberly.

Circuit Judge Carl Harper was scheduled to hear arguments Tuesday, then to rule on her testimony. She had them off on vacation to Missouri over what has been an emotionally bitter courtroom battle being little to the imagination.

Harper has heard accusations of drug abuse, bigamy, incest, adultery, occultism and lesbianism, all apparently intended to sway his decision on which Pulitzer should retain custody of the couple's twin 5-year-old sons.

Also at stake is the Pulitzer fortune, pegged at \$25 million by Mrs. Pulitzer, but estimated at one tenth that amount by her husband.

In the final day of testimony Monday, lawyers for Pulitzer 52, called a surprise witness, testified he saw Mrs. Pulitzer 31, lying in bed with Kimberly 32.

The charge of lesbianism was leveled at Mrs. Pulitzer by the trial by her husband and she and Kimberly both vehemently denied it.

But Steve Anderson, a former mate on Pulitzer's yacht "Sea Hunter," was the first to testify he saw the two women bed.

Anderson said he entered Pulitzer mansion in the spring 1979 to make a telephone call. He did not knock, a practice common among Pulitzer employees, and once inside saw two women in bed together in a floor bedroom, he testified.

"I noticed four legs protruding from the end of the bed," he said. "Then, I saw one set of slide off and up stood a woman totally naked."

Anderson said he then noticed the "other set of legs slide off and up stood Roxanne Pulitzer in a very sheer night gown. She asked what I was doing. I said I was going to make a phone call and left."

The naked woman was Kimberly, he said.

Kimberly's husband, Kleeber, heir James Kimberly, 76, who had a gold ring in his right ear, rebutted the charge. He testified he and his wife traveled out of Palm Beach to six cities in the spring of 1979 and did not return to Palm Beach until mid-May.
