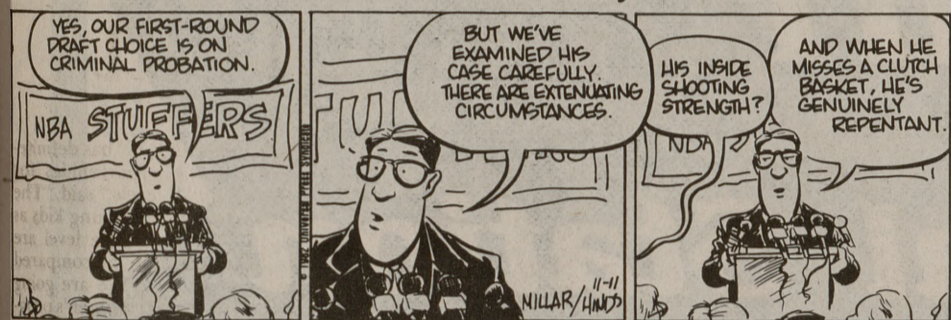

Bulldogs can secure Sugar with triumph

NEW YORK — Top-ranked Georgia, No. 12 Michigan and probation-plagued Arizona State try to wrap up major bowl berths Saturday, with the three teams only a victory away from locking up their conference titles.

Undefeated Georgia, led by running back Herschel Walker, is at Auburn in a Southeastern Conference matchup. The Bulldogs know a victory over the Tigers will give them the host role in the Sugar Bowl for the third straight year.

Michigan, which got off to a 1-2 start, has won six straight for a 6-0 Big Ten Conference record and with a victory over Purdue, the Wolverines would earn their fifth trip to the Rose Bowl in the last seven years.

Arizona State, 9-0, hosts No. 6 Washington Saturday night and a triumph over the Huskies, 8-1, would assure the Sun Devils the Pacific-10 Conference crown and their first trip to the Rose Bowl. Southern California, which has a chance to tie the Arizona State for the Pac-10 title, is ineligible for the conference title and post-season play.

EAST — Pittsburgh 45, Army 14 — Since quarterback Dan Marino enrolled at Pitt four years ago, the Panthers have never lost more than one game in a season.

West Virginia 28, Rutgers 20 (Thursday night) — WVU headed for the minor bowl of its choice.

Others: Boston College 27, Syracuse 19; Brown 21, Dartmouth 20; Temple 21, Colgate 17; Columbia 35, Cornell 20; Pennsylvania 24, Harvard 23; Princeton 28, Yale 27.

SOUTH — Alabama 24, Southern Mississippi 14 — Alabama rebounds against demoralized Southern Miss., slapped with a two-year probation Monday.

Georgia 28, Auburn 20 — Georgia makes it to the Sugar Bowl for the third straight year.

Maryland 22, Clemson 21 — Maryland takes control in the ACC.

Mississippi State 24, Louisiana State 21 — LSU comes out flat after emotional victory over Alabama.

North Carolina 35, Virginia 7 — North Carolina ends its two-game slide.

Florida State 49, Louisville 10 — Florida State has another breather.

Others: Florida 35, Kentucky 10; Tennessee 31, Mississippi 27; North Carolina State 31, Duke 28; South Carolina 21, Navy 18; Vanderbilt 28, Virginia Tech 27; Wake Forest 35, Georgia Tech 24; East Carolina 27, William & Mary 17.

MIDWEST — Nebraska 42, Iowa State 13 — After this victory, Nebraska has two weeks to prepare for Oklahoma.

Michigan 35, Purdue 20 — It's off to the Rose Bowl for Michigan.

Penn State 24, Notre Dame 21 — Victories over two Pennsylvania teams in a row is too much, even for the Fighting Irish.

Others: Bowling Green 21, Eastern Michigan 13; Illinois 27, Indiana 24; Iowa 22, Wisconsin 21; Kansas State 27, Oklahoma State 23; Ohio State 42, Northwestern 21; Minnesota 24, Michigan State 21.

Playoffs around corner

For the football fanatic — and Texas has a few — there will be three hotbeds of activity this weekend as the first round of playoffs begin in Class 5A, 3A and 2A, while zone playoffs and final district games are held in Class 4A and 1A.

Beginning in the south, Hotbed No. 1 is Houston's Astrodome where five Class 5A bi-district games have been scheduled Friday and Saturday. In a double-header Friday, Houston Stratford or Alief Elsik will play Houston Westbury and Houston Washington will play last season's state runner-up, Houston Yates.

At 11:30 a.m. Saturday, Plano plays Dallas Kimball; at 4 p.m. Nacogdoches and Temple play; and at 7:30, Bryan and Marshall play.

But Lubbock may be the busiest of all. Three of the five high schools in the west Texas town are headed to the playoffs. Two of them, Dunbar and Estacado, meet to decide the District 1-4A title. Both teams are 6-0 in district, and only Estacado has a loss — a 14-0 season opener against Plainview, winner of District 3-5A.

Even when there's nothing else at stake, Dunbar coach Ken Wallace said. "The boys know each other and go to church together, so this one is for the bragging rights."

Under the UIL's expanded playoff structure this season, both Lubbock schools are assured playoff spots. But second place means a matchup with District 2 winner San Angelo Lakeview, ranked fourth in the state.

"I think the team that wins will have a slight advantage going into the playoffs," Wallace

said. "San Angelo Lakeview has a very good team. That's not taking anything away from whoever ends up second in that district. Monahans or Andrews will be a tough game too."

Louis Kelley, head coach at Estacado, says he hopes its not the last time he plays Dunbar this season. The two teams could meet again the third week of playoffs.

"Boy that'd be great to play them again," he said. "I hope we both do that well in the playoffs. I hope Monterey goes far too."

Ags' Kubiak works out; improved

Texas A&M quarterback Gary Kubiak practiced Wednesday for the first time since injuring his leg against SMU two weeks ago.

"I think he's making some improvement," Aggie coach Jackie Sherrill said. "It's a day-to-day thing."

Kubiak has a chip fracture of the left ankle and earlier in the week Sherrill said he doubted his starting quarterback would even make the trip when the Aggies play Arkansas in Little Rock Saturday night at 7.
