Workers get ready for bonfire push

 Construction on the 1982 bonfire will be slightly behind schedule when push starts next week, but it should be larger than last year's bonfire because more wood was cut this fall, head civilian junior Mark Hackfeld says.

Hackfeld, an accounting major from Abilene, said work on the stack is slightly behind schedule because of a lack of workers.

The late afternoon to early morning hours have been the most active, Hackfeld said. Corps workers usually come ab-

out 4 p.m. and civilians at about 7 p.m. They usually quit around 2 a.m., but redpots and others stay all night.

Hackfeld said he expects a lot of workers to come out to work during push week, which starts Monday. Push week is the period when construction on the bonfire is continuous; it starts the week before bonfire burns.

Flyers giving information about push week will go up in dormitories soon and Corps staff will coordinate a schedule to maximize help from the Corps. An open house for faculty and staff will be held from 12 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Wednesday. The open

house is designed to show how goes on at the site and how bonfire is built.

Hackfeld said 68 trucks of wood are on the site or already on the stack. Trucks range from 150 small logs to large logs, which are used outside of the bonfire.

Money for bonfire has come easily this year, Hackfeld said.

Writers speak against censorship of textbooks

AUSTIN — The Board of Education heard final protests against textbooks proposed for use in public schools before voting today on which books will be on the state's \$35 million shopping list.

Textbook critics Mel and Norma Gabler of Longview are among nine groups and individuals planning to present criticisms of proposed texts.

The Gablers, Baptist fundamentalists who object to scores of books on the grounds they glorify Communism or deal too lightly with the hazards of drugs, have drawn protests from several groups that oppose textbook censorship.

In anticipation of the hearings, a group of Texas authors scheduled a rally to protest the Gablers' influence over textbook adoption.

The Texas Institute of Letters and several other groups scheduled an "Evening of Forbidden Books" last night, and several noted writers were to read from previously banned books.

Humorist John Henry Falk, who was blacklisted during the Communist scare of the 1950s, and Dallas journalist Molly Ivins

also planned to read from pounds of objections filed year by the Gablers.

Novelist James Michener, author of such historical works "Hawaii" and "Centennial," his books had been banned the past and he deplored censorship. Michener is residing in Austin while he researches a novel about Texas.

Under state law, the member board can recommend only those texts recommended by Commissioner of Education Raymond Bynum, who is scheduled to present his recommendations Friday. The board vote to adopt the texts will be held on Monday.

The textbook adoption proceedings in Texas are particularly important to publishers because most states pattern textbook purchases after that of Texas and California.
