Science bypasses paralysis

United Press International DAYTON, Ohio — A young woman who is paralyzed from the waist down had a 50-50 chance Thursday of becoming the first paralysis victim to walk

by means of computerized electrical stimulation. Nan Davis, 22, has been confined to a wheelchair since a car

accident the night of her highschool graduation. But in recent months, her legs have been exercised and strengthened by computerized electrical stimula-tion in a Wright State University

laboratory

Wright State scientists scheduled a demonstration and news conference to showcase their technology, which previously has made it possible for para-lyzed patients to pedal bicycles and tricycles.

Wright State officials believe in the near future the technology will enable her and other paralyzed people to walk.

For the past 13 years, Dr. Jerrold Petrofsky, director of Wright State's biomedical engineering lab, has been refining technology in which he links electric current with computers to produce movement in otherwise lifeless muscles of paralysis patients.

He tapes electrodes to the skin over six major muscle groups in the legs and programs a computer to order successive, milli-second bursts of electrical stimulation to the appropriate muscles at the appropriate times. Instantaneous feedback to the computer regulates the movements.

Petrofsky said in patients who have been able to pedal bicycles and tricycles the movements are as smooth as those of a normal

Petrofsky's ultimate goal is to allow paralyzed people to walk freely with microprocessers (tiny computers on chips) im-planted near their paralyzed

Student takes 9 hostage

United Press International BURKE, Va. — A jilted teer ger armed with a rifle released sixth hostage early Thursday but still held three others in an office of Virginia's largest high

Police said James Stevens, l was despondent because his gir friend rejected him. Stevens n leased one woman but held Lake Braddock High School Principal John Alwood, and another man and woman.

Stevens, who fired severa shots at his girlfriend and police forcing evacuation of the school took nine hostages at the outse of the drama Wednesday after noon. He later traded five hostages for food.

The sixth hostage to be free was Frances Ramsey, an employee in the data processing de

The school, the largest in the state with 4,300 students, was ordered closed today because the standoff. Telephone servio was cut off because Stevens had been trying to make calls to Texas and elsewhere, officer

Police, who said Stevens was armed with a .22-caliber rife with a telescopic site, indicated they were willing to wait out the situation.

"This guy is under tremen dous strain and has put himsel in a difficult position. We have made significant progress since yesterday and we are not about to over-react to a situation like this," said Buracker.

Fairfax County Police Capt Andrew Page said Stevens had made no demands.

Teachers said Stevens was able to get in almost unnoticed with the rifle because they thought he was carrying a prop for a production of the musica "Oklahoma."

Police said on Wednesday Stevens asked for coffee, ice cream, sodas and a pizza.
