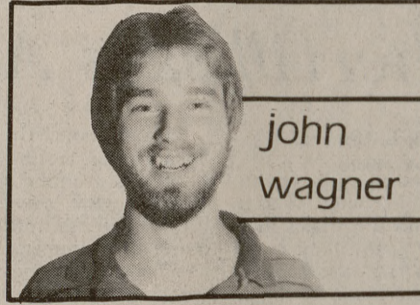

Sherman Corbett, a left-handed pitcher from Schertz, and Todd Edwards, a second baseman from Houston, have moved one step closer to becoming members of the U.S. baseball team that will participate in the Pan American Games held in Caracas, Venezuela, Aug. 14-29. The two Aggies are also potential candidates for the U.S. Olympic baseball team. Corbett and Edwards went through tryouts held at V.J. Keefe Field in San Antonio Oct. 31. They were selected to a nation-wide pool of baseball players that will be watched closely during the spring by the United States Baseball Federation.

If you closed your eyes, you could almost hear Don Meredith, the ghost of Mustangs and Cowboys past, his East Texas drawl crooning from the press box in Texas Stadium. "Turn out the lights, the party's o-o-o-v-v-e-r!" SMU was indeed turning the lights out on Texas A&M, turning turnovers into touchdowns and playing wicked defense. It was a long Saturday. Okay, Dandy. Fade the lights, fade your voice, and fade the Aggies' bowl hopes, as Eric Dickerson and the Mustangs bounced the Aggies from the ranks of the bowl-begging, 49-7. A 4-4 record with two of the top teams in the nation still left on the slate does not a bowl contender make. And with Gary Kubiak on the sideline for an undetermined amount of time, things look grim indeed for the Aggies. As Dandy Don says, the party is over — at least for this year. But Coach Jackie Sherrill and his Aggies still have a chance to turn the lights out on Arkansas, Texas and TCU. Two victories out of three might put the Aggies back in the bowl picture faster than SMU grad Meredith could say, "Aw, shucks, Howard." Don't get your hopes up though. To risk using a cliché, the Aggies are going to have to take the rest of the season one

Rest assured that the majority of those folks in the stands on Saturday will be decked to their hog hats in Razorback red, and woe to the team that happens to be in the way when they call the hog. It's easy to be stampeded when you play Arkansas. The Aggies will attest to that. The Razorbacks have won the last five contests between the two teams, and the lead the 79-year-old series, 33-19-3. Last year, the Razorbacks drove 81 yards in the fourth quarter to take a 10-7 lead, and a last-gasp comeback by the Aggies was snuffed out by Billy Ray Smith's crunching tackle of Kubiak. Kubiak fumbled the ball, and Arkansas recovered to seal the game. That, however, was last year. Kubiak won't even get to play this time around. And when quarterback John Elkan takes the field on Saturday, it will be his first career start for the Aggies. The sophomore from Baytown Lee High School had an understandably shaky game against the Mustangs, and this will be his first chance to play an entire game. Unfortunately, getting to play an entire game against the Arkansas defense is not always a blessing. The Razorbacks, with apologies to Dandy Don Meredith, always have their hands on the light switch.
