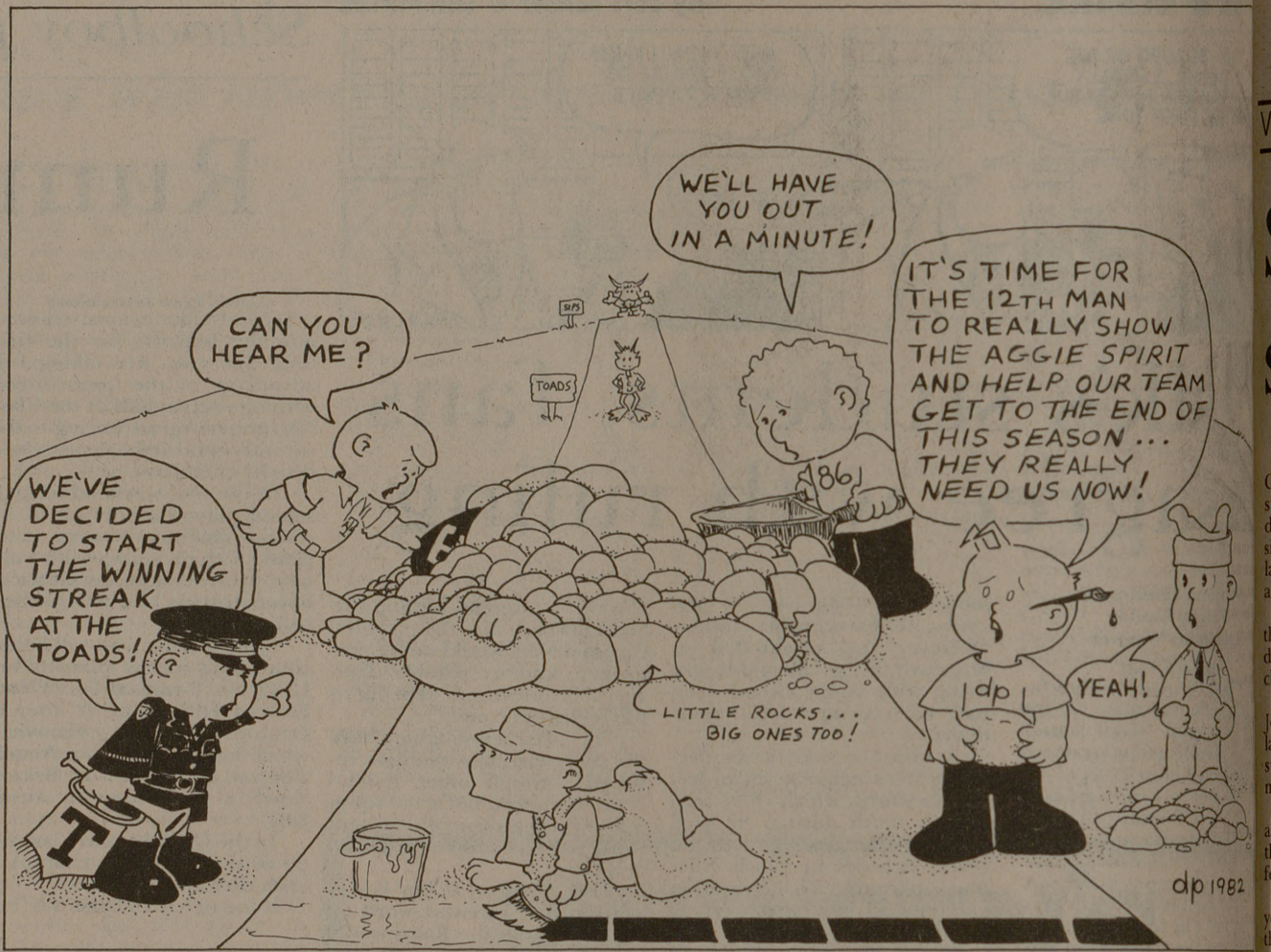

"It's not the team you have, it's the lawyer you have," he said. So, it was the Stratford Spartans — not the Elsik Rams — who represented District 17-5A

against the District 18-5A champion Westbury Rebels.

Westbury head coach T.J. Mills said that because of the confusion, his team practiced Tuesday and Thursday for a game against Elsik, and Monday and Wednesday for a game against Stratford.

At the Astrodome Friday night there was a small group of people who were slightly angry. That group consisted of Elsik

fans and players.

Terry Campbell, father of Elsik cheerleader Mindy Campbell, said: "High school sports are for many things — most importantly character-building and learning to play by the rules."

"Stratford went ahead and let Niles play even after they knew that they were violating UIL rules."


However, David Bonnett, an administrative principal at Stratford, said Niles was certified by

the school as eligible at the

ginning of the season. Stratford, trailing 20-5 at the start of the fourth quarter, tied to score 18 points in the six minutes of the game.

The controversy over eligibility remains in the courts. The next hearing is scheduled for 2 p.m. Wednesday.

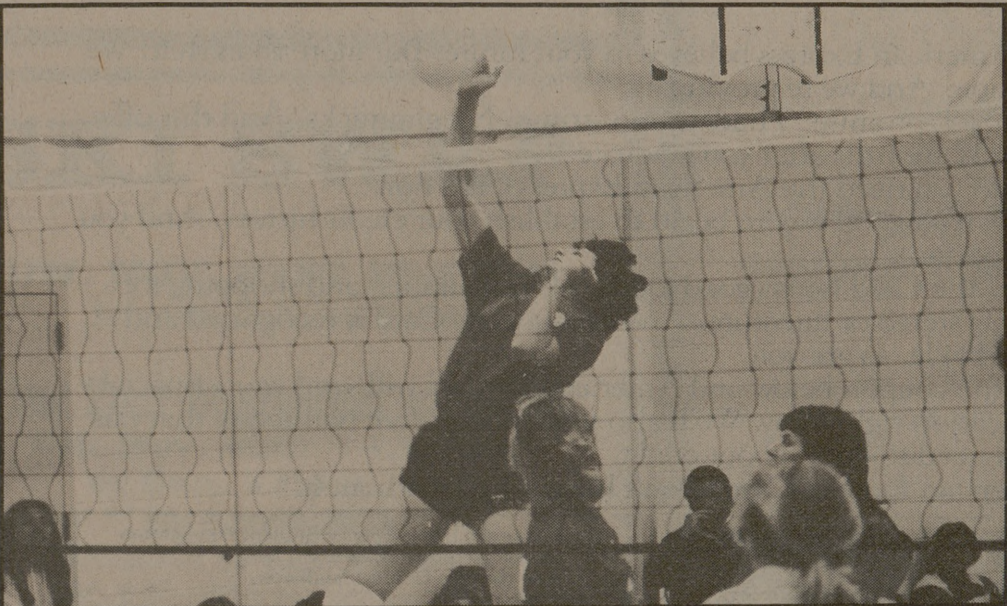

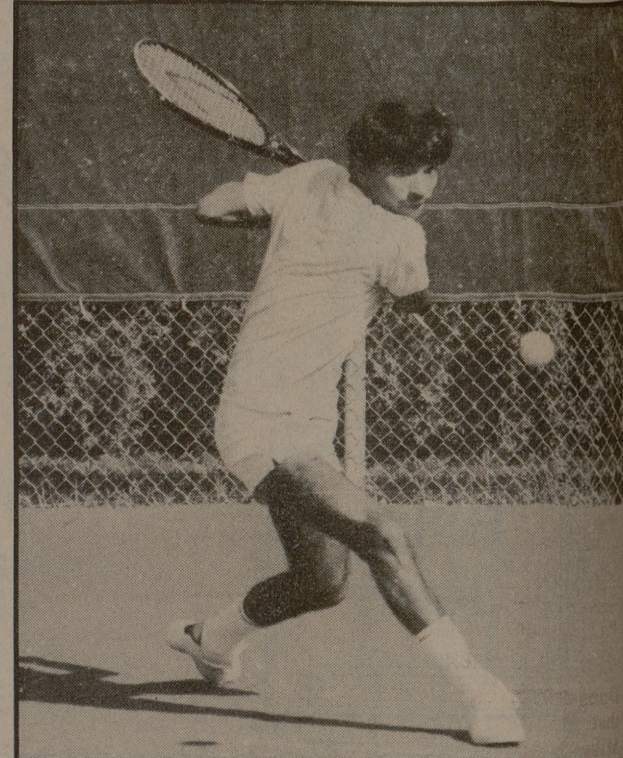
