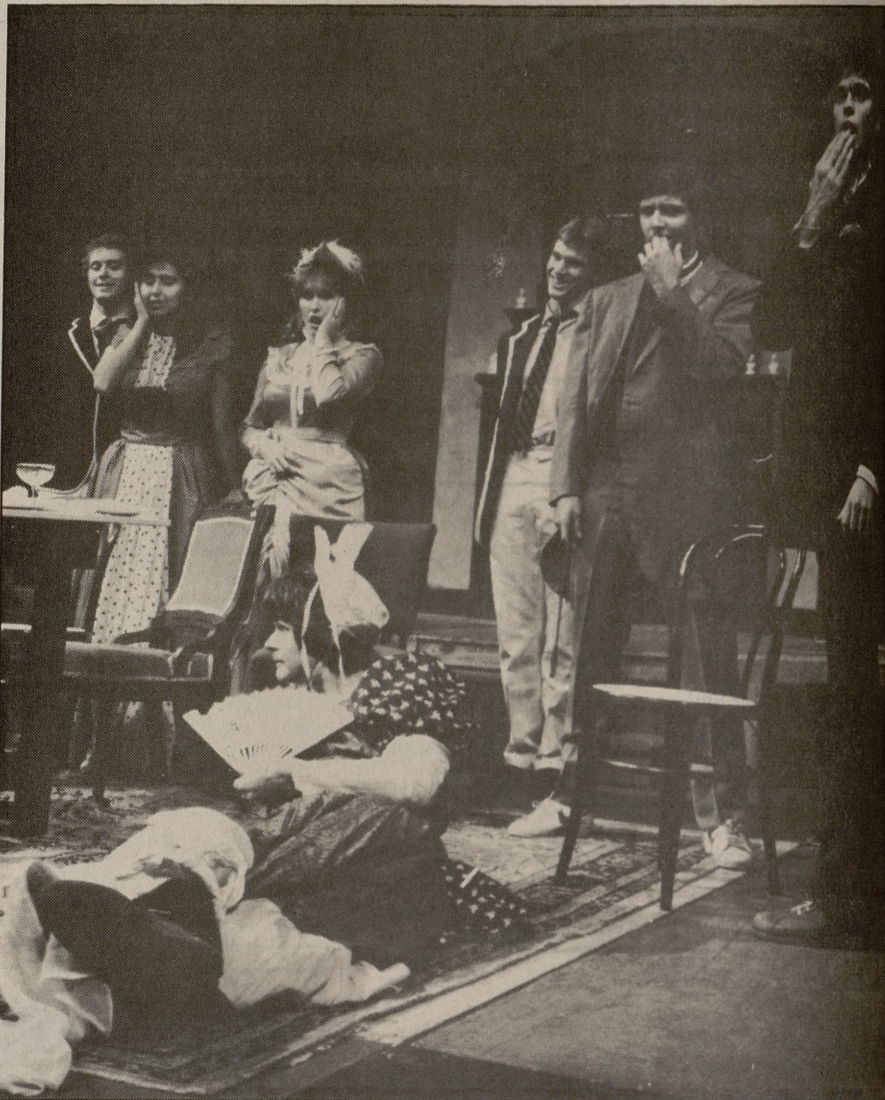
has been wanting more non-Corps support."

Contest to pick weekend scores starts publicity for Big Event

A contest to pick the score of the Texas A&M/TCU game kicks off publicity today for The Big Event, an all-community

service project sponsored by Student Government.

Tables for the contest will be set up in the MSC today, Thursday and Saturday. To enter, one

must predict the outcome of Saturday's game and donate at least one coin to The Big Event. The winner of the contest will receive a football autograph by the Texas A&M football team.

Scheduled for Feb. 20, The Big Event is a campus and community-wide effort to assist President Reagan's "call to volunteerism."

Students and faculty at Texas A&M and citizens of Bryan College Station will participate in a variety of non-profit volunteer service projects. Projects include activities such as: donating labor to improve United Way organization facilities, working with campus ministry groups and their affiliate churches serving individuals and cleaning up the Bryan-College Station city parks.

The Student Government Student Services Committee will serve as coordinator for the activities of participating campus organizations, and help any group find a project.

Workers will volunteer 10 hours of labor to charity organizations or individuals and groups will be able to choose their projects. There will be a basis for determining the need of services to individuals organizations.

Any organization that wants to participate in The Big Event should pick up a participation form in the Student Program Office in the MCS. Forms are due Tuesday, Nov. 23.

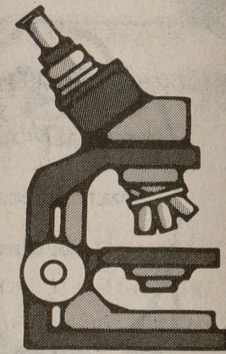
