## Braniff, union talks on resuming flights

DALLAS — Talks between bankrupt Braniff International and four labor unions continued late into the night as the two sides tried to come to terms on contracts that would enable the grounded carrier to fly once again.

Braniff has come to terms with the dispatcher's union, but contracts are still not settled with the Teamsters, machinists, pilots and flight attendants, said Jack Boisen, a Braniff labor relations executive.

Braniff and Pacific Southwest Airlines of San Diego, announced plans for a joint operating venture in mid-October, but all five unions must approve the plan before it can be implemented.

Braniff officials were to go before a federal bankruptcy judge Tuesday, and they Monday they would ask for third extension on a deadline for filing a reorganization plan.

"We will not be ready to present a comprehensive reorganization plan," Boisen said Tuesday's appearance in the Worth federal bankruptcy court. "We will have to ask for another extension."

"We're getting closer to reaching some agreements on labor negotiations," he said. "but we still have a ways to go. We are still optimistic we will have firm contracts with them."

If the joint venture with PSA is launched, Braniff will be under the PSA name but Braniff airplanes and employees.

## Voting investigation to examine Dallas

DALLAS — A public inquiry by the Dallas County Commissioners about voting problems Nov. 2 will begin Monday amid charges of ballot shortages and improper sign postings.

A spokesman for a voters' organization called for blacks to boycott the hearing.

Some blacks and Democrats said signs, which warned of jail terms for voting fraud, were intended to discourage blacks from voting at some precincts in Dallas County.

Testimony will be recorded by a court reporter and made available to the Dallas County district attorney's office and the U.S. Justice Department. Both agencies are investigating the charges of voting irregularities.

John Wiley Price, Progressive Voters League president, said the inquiry would "be nothing more than a whitewash." He

wants black election officials provide information to a grand jury or to the U.S. Justice Department, not to a public hearing.

"We feel the Constitution was violated and we want criminal prosecution," Price said. He said the ballot shortages were caused by a "statewide conspiracy against blacks."

Price said ballot shortages in black precincts in Harris County and shortages in 28 south Dallas and Oak Cliff precincts were ample of the conspiracy.

Conny Drake, Dallas County elections administrator, blamed the unexpectedly high voter turnout for ballot shortages in about 28 of the county's 400 precincts. She said the problems were increased when the communications system used to dispatch election workers to deliver ballots broke down.

## Lone Star gets temporary hike

AUSTIN — Though authorized to temporarily raise its rates by \$42.9 million a year, Lone Star Gas Co. has no immediate plans to implement the new fees to its 1.1 million customers, a company official said.

Lone Star filed for a \$90 million rate increase on June 2, but it later agreed to a negotiated increase of \$42.9 million after talks with the Texas Municipal League and individual cities that would be affected.

Lone Star spokesman Warren Fulks said the company asked for permission to implement bonded rates to protect itself should the Railroad Commission fail to approve the negotiated settlement.

"Under the terms of the bond, we could begin billing on Dec. 1 for November usage, but we're not legally required to do that," said Fulks. "As of the people I've talked to, the decision has not been made to implement the higher rates."

Lone Star posted an \$8 million bond to cover the temporary rate agreement approved by the commission Tuesday.

Fulks noted that if Lone Star charged the higher rates under the bond and the commission approved a lower rate schedule, it would be required to make refunds with 9 percent interest.

The three-member commission has not set a firm date to issue a final order, but it reportedly review the case after the commission examiner's report is issued Monday.

Fulks said the company expects the commission to rule before the end of the year.

Lone Star serves more than 400 cities that purchase natural gas from the utility for resale. The increase is expected to be passed on to about 1.1 million ratepayers.

The rate hike is expected to cause the average residential bill to rise by \$1.92 a month, based on usage of 6,000 cubic feet.
