Computers may make lawyers' work harder

United Press International NEW YORK — The compu-ter is creating headaches and even nightmares for the legal profession.

Although it can make legal research vastly easier, the computer is causing thousands of suits that are a difficult, if profitable, business for lawyers, said Bruce Brickman of the New York firm of Braverman & Rosen.

Many of these suits have criminal angles which may force civil laywers to practice criminal law, he said

selves defendants in computer crime cases or be forced to take action as plaintiffs to protect themselves.

Computer crime, a matter of a few isolated cases a few years trol back, now is a growing problem. Brickman said there already are at least 3,000 lawsuits pending in the country involving computer crime and computer negligence. most is misrepresentation in contracts by computer equipment makers and marketers, software companies and service

Brickman said many of these contracts are designed to benefit the seller, not the buyer or computer user and are drafted to keep the seller in complete con-

A law firm is vulnerable itself because of its vast amounts of valuable information that can be stolen or misused criminally.

In addition, Brickman said, One area of computer fraud many law firms don't realize that which may hurt law firms the a computer system may require many law firms don't realize that a professional operator. That means an attorney no longer will have direct access to his files and is, in effect, hostage to the computer expert.




