The program also is beneficial because it is not like a parent or an authority figure telling the offenders what to do, she said. The probation department also uses visual aids to help prevent juvenile crime.

Through the Prevention Program, the probation department gives presentations for Bryan and College Station schools, University classes, civic

organizations and churches. The presentations are intended to promote awareness of alternatives to delinquent behavior.

McNutt said the presentations give the latest information about department activities. The presentations include films, filmstrips, slide shows, lectures and handouts.

The department also has a restitution program in which the department collects payment for damages or property lost to a victim of a juvenile crime.

Restitution is part of probation and is collected from the juvenile offender, McNutt said. Payment is made to the victim by the county clerk. In 1981, \$6,889.15 was collected from juveniles.

"Restitution makes juveniles realize the monetary loss and financial responsibility that is involved in a crime," McNutt said. "That's a realization that probably did not occur to them at the time they committed it."

For young offenders who cannot make restitution, the probation department offers the Saturday Work Program. Some of the offenders are too

young to work and earn money, and others may come from families who do not have enough money, McNutt said.

The children and teenagers pick up trash, weed flower beds and plant flowers in area parks, she said.

For older offenders, between the ages of 15 and 17, the department provides group counseling. McNutt, who leads the sessions, said the purpose of group counseling is to help the juveniles develop better social skills, including searching and applying for employment, job interviews and dealing with peer pressure.

Once a week, for six to eight weeks, juveniles attend sessions and discuss things happening in their lives that might cause problems. Problems mentioned often by the offenders range from family difficulties to school complaints.

Another form of group counseling is the Shoplifting Diversion Program.

Juveniles who commit a shoplifting offense attend the program for an entire day, viewing films, attending lectures and

forming groups to discuss what they shoplifted, the peer pressure involved and ways to avoid shoplifting, McNutt said.

The program tries to meet the needs of individual offenders and get them back on the right track, McNutt said. If the program is successfully completed the youngster can be released from probation, she said.

Wentreck said a new juvenile probation facility will be built at Bryan-College Station in about two years. The detention center, which he said will resemble a secure dorm area, will house juvenile offenders.

Until the new facility is finished, juvenile offenders are kept in a private section of the county jail that is used exclusively for young offenders. The area is completely separate from adult offenders, he said.

Wentreck said the new facility is a holding facility — not a "mini-prison." An offender who is placed there will stay for not more than 48 hours, he said. He said the staff hopes to have a chance to evaluate the situation and come up with a solution.

Clubs, floats spoof Rose Bowl parade

United Press International PASADENA, Calif. — Everyone was out of step at the Sixth Occasional Doo Dah Parade — the Canerettes smoked cigarettes and the nudists wore clothes.

But the 40,000 spectators along Colorado Boulevard in Pasadena, Calif., loved it.

Peter Apanel, organizer of the parade, says the event somehow "has a life of its own." The parade is a yearly spoof on the famous Tournament of Roses parade. But none of the floats in Sunday's parade had a single flower, Apanel said. It's a Doo Dah rule.

The most popular group in the parade was the 20-member Precision Briefcase Drill Team.

the oldest entry in the parade. The Dull Men's Club from Newport Beach blew leaves and litter to the side along the parade route while their wives marched along throwing out more leaves to be swept up.

The blindfolded "Stay the Course" group wearing masks of President Reagan's face performed an uncoordinated drill. A ballet dancer wearing a tutu and doing pirouettes represented Reagan's son, Ron, who is a dancer with the Joffrey Ballet.

The annual conglomeration of baton droppers thrilled the crowd, and the local nudist club showed up fully dressed and displayed placards saying, "Nudes Don't Shoot Cops" and "Have a

Nude Day." The Texas Chainsaw Massacre Droll Team wore bloody aprons, the Budweiser Precision Handtruck Team did a routine with cases of beer and the Northridge Kiwanis wore Richard Nixon masks with placards saying, "Blow the Whistle on Crime."

The Marching Leech Kazoo Band, humming "Zippity Doo Dah," carried a sign saying, "Leech Out, Leech Out, Leech Out and Suck Someone."

The California Council of Tall Clubs paid the \$3 entry fee so its 7-foot-tall-plus members could look down on the crowd. The cancer society's Canerettes showed up wearing giant cigarette packs with brand names such as, "Slayem," "Lucky Stroke," "Dark" and "DeMerit."

A small number of kids develop secondary sex characteristics very early in life, before age 8 in girls and age 10 in boys. The condition is called precocious puberty and now there appears to be an effective treatment.
