Harrelson denies charges from former fellow inmate

SAN ANTONIO — Charles Harrelson, undergoing continued cross-examination in his defense of murdering federal Judge John H. Wood, Wednes-day denied he ever said he feared authorities would "burn me for ringing Wood's bell."

During the morning, pro-secutors dealt with loose ends in the case against Harrelson, bringing up the quote from a man who lived in a cell near Harrelson in 1981.

That inmate, John Lee Spinelli, testified earlier he was returning from a shower when

he glimpsed Harrelson watching a television news report. The report was about Harrelson's stepdaughter, Teresa Starr, refusing to testify to the grand jury investigating Wood's death.

Spinelli said he overheard

Harrelson say, "If she talks, they're going to burn me for ringing Wood's bell."

Harrelson claimed Spinelli had "plagiarized" the statement from a March 21, 1981, article in the Dallas Morning News. The story dealt with Harrelson's 1973 conviction for the murderfor-hire of south Texas grain dealer Sam Degelia.

The article quoted a witness dering Wood if the government that trial, Jerry Watkins, who would pay his family \$250 testified he drove the getaway car for Harrelson after Degelia was killed. Watkins was quoted as saying Harrelson returned to the car and said, "Drive! It's a damn good thing you stayed or I would have rung your bell, too.'

Four Houston robbers 'killed American dream'

United Press International HOUSTON — A prosecutor said four men convicted of robbing and fatally shooting a groc-ery store owner had also killed the American dream.

The four men were convicted of aggravated robbery and sent-enced Tuesday to prison terms exceeding 75 years each.

The jury sentenced gunman Aaron Dwayne Proctor, 16, to 99 years in prison. His partners in crime, Leon O. Boyd, 20, Jonathan Lemell, 18, and Patrick Robinson, 20, were each sentenced to 75 years in prison.

Evidence in the trial showed they planned to rob and kill Wing K. Lew, 61, a neighborhood grocer known as "Mr. Friendly" because of the favors he did for his customers by extending credit when they had no money for groceries.

Lew, an immigrant from China to the United States in 1940, built a successful business and paid for the education of his three children. Prosecutor Rusty Hardin said Lew had earned his golden years before he was


