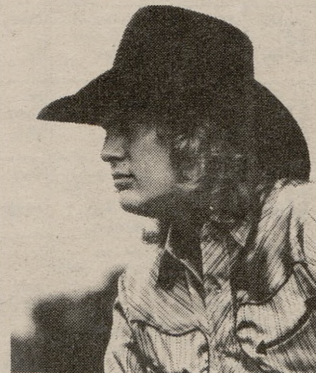
Anderson to perform
