Congress to consider job-creating legislation

WASHINGTON — Members of Congress, shaken by growing unemployment lines in their states, are taking a hard look at job-creating legislation.

Congressional leaders Friday said the sharp jump in the November unemployment rate to a post-Depression record 10.8 percent probably will boost support for job-creating legislation, including the administration's gas tax increase and a Democratic public works bill.

Although the administration refuses to characterize its \$5.5 billion gas tax proposal as a "jobs bill," it hopes the proposal will generate about 320,000 jobs, including repairing the nation's roads, bridges and mass transit systems.

House Democrats, who generally support the gas tax bill, want additional legislation. They say their \$5-billion-public-works proposal will create about 350,000 jobs.

The House will consider the gas tax bill today and the supplemental jobs bill later next week.

The 10.8 percent unemployment rate announced Friday means 12 million Americans are now without jobs.

"This recession has really taken on the dimensions of a depression," House Democratic leader Jim Wright of Texas said. "Anyone who says we do not need a jobs bill is just blinking at the facts."

House Speaker Thomas O'Neill said he believes the latest increase in the unemployment will swing additional votes in favor of the Democratic jobs bill

which the House takes it up next week.

O'Neill said the bill would be financed out of the general fund — with no new taxes — but pointed out that it in turn would reduce the amount the government has to pay in unemployment benefits.

Assistant Senate Republican leader Ted Stevens agreed the House probably will pass the Democratic jobs bill, but the Senate will not. He predicted that the Senate ultimately will add more jobs to its version of the highway bill.

Patrolman, freight train have standoff in Illinois

ELMHURST, Ill. — Patrolman Daniel Buenz almost got carried away, but he collared his suspect — a freight train.

Authorities said a half-hour standoff started Friday morning when Buenz boarded the train. Police say it blocked seven intersections in the western Chicago suburb for 15 minutes — five minutes more than ordinances allow.

Buenz said the conductor initially refused to identify himself when he entered the caboose, then refused to leave with him to go to the police station. Buenz returned to his car to radio for assistance.

When he returned to the caboose, the train began moving, traveling seven blocks before Buenz pulled the emergency

brake. The conductor was arrested on charges of obstructing a police officer and for obstructing a street.

A spokesman for the Chicago & North Western called the incident a misunderstanding and said the train actually was stopped for less than 10 minutes.
