**Jury says \$4 million stock part of industrialist's estate**

DALLAS — Instead of being some \$4 million richer today, James Decker has another court battle to face if he is to prove that he is entitled to Texas Pacific Land Trust Certificate 390. A Dallas jury decided Friday that the stock, which was issued in 1888 and is now worth about \$4 million, had been used as partial repayment on a \$15,000 debt owed by Joseph Decker, a bankrupt investment banker, and awarded ownership of the certificate to the estate of a New York industrialist who made the 1890 loan. "I don't know how they could have done that," said the Arizona man as he left the courtroom. Unless the case is appealed by Decker, the money will go to the estate of Joseph R. DeLamar, who made the loan, and will be divided equally among his daughter and the medical schools at Harvard, Columbia and Johns Hopkins universities. It took 86 years to resolve the matter because the stock was believed lost. A retired San Francisco banker, who read about the unclaimed fortune which awaited someone in Dallas, found the certificate in a Wells Fargo

Bank vault in 1977. Documents found with the stock linked it to the \$15,298.48 loan from DeLamar to Decker. The Dallas jury had to determine whether the certificate was collateral for the loan or partial repayment. If it had been collateral, Decker's heirs still would own it, pending repayment of his debts.

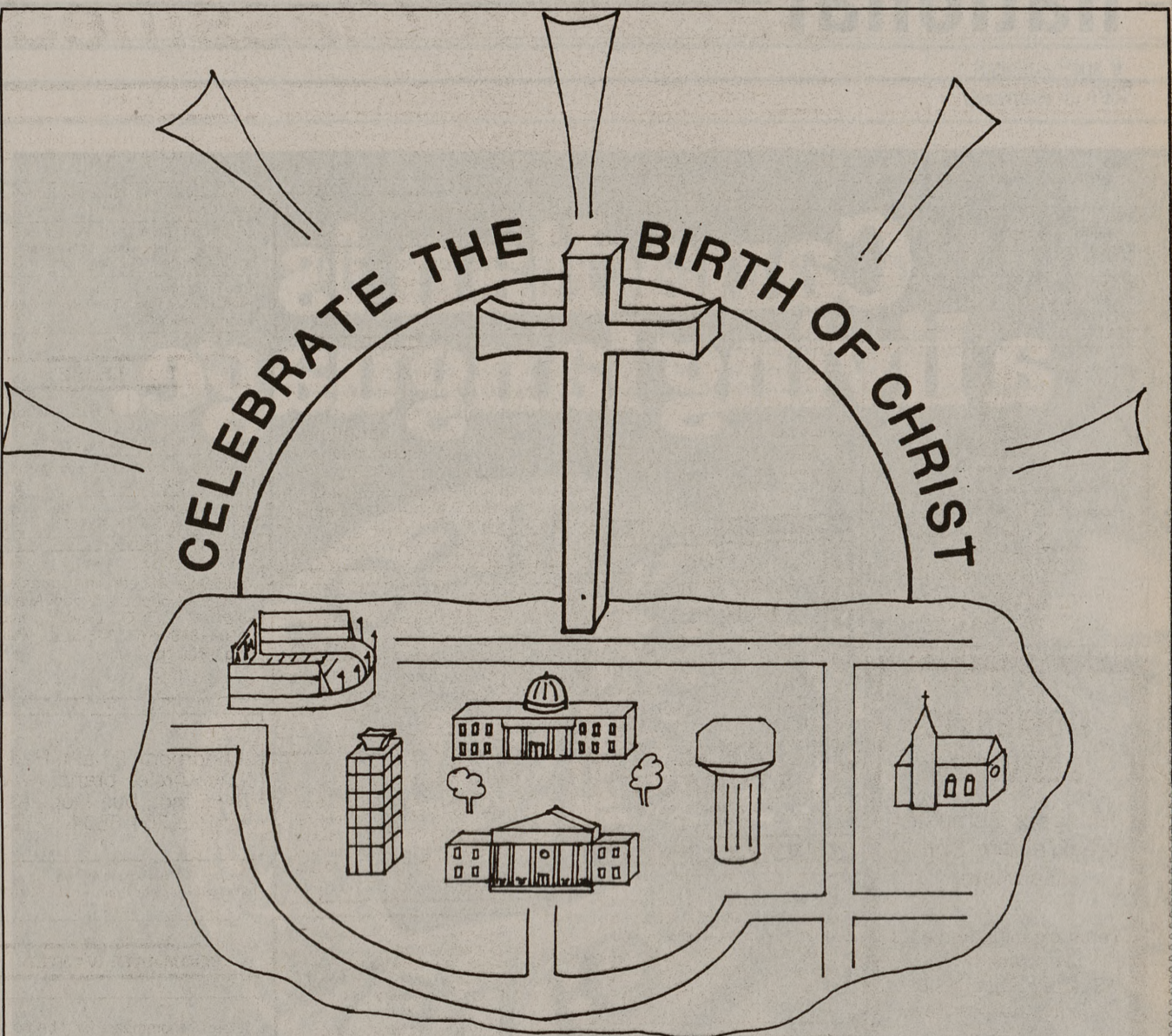
"I think morally we all wanted to give the money to the Decker people," said juror Charles Rosenkranz. "But legally, we had to decide the way we did." Lawyers for Decker said they intend to ask District Judge Craig Enoch to set aside the ruling by the jury as contrary to evidence.
