Dement said that he will qualify for unemmployment benefits of about \$147 per week. Most of his hope, Dement admits, lies in a union-initiated plan that would put some workers on as temporary laborers. His pay rate would drop from around \$12 an hour to about \$8.75 — the union's bottom
