"It depends a great deal on the decision itself as to what happens from there," he said. "There's no way I can presuppose what would happen — it depends on the information that comes out of the hearing. It could run the full gamut, all the way from relatively minor action up to and including removal from the University.

"Once that's over, the students certainly have the option to appeal that decision to the University disciplinary appeals panel."

Kibler said Sherrill's action and the University action, if taken, would be entirely separate matters.

"Coach Sherrill's action is, in a

way, a University action because he is a University official," he said. "But as far as that being a University disciplinary action, it's not.

"The football team might be analogous to the Corps (of Cadets) or to some other student organization. Although the football team is a lot bigger deal, in its foundation, it's similar.

"For instance," Kibler said, "the commandant can remove a student from the Corps of Cadets, without that being a University disciplinary action, for a violation of Corps policy that may not even be reflected in

University policy. Part of a student's contract when he signs up for the Corps is that he'll comply with both the rules of the University and the rules of the Corps."

Kibler said the Aggie football players must abide by the same kinds of rules.

"They've not only got to comply with the rules of being a student," he said, "but they've got to comply with Coach Sherrill's rules as well — whatever those may be.

"It's an action that he can take that's separate and apart from

anything we may do. In most cases, he'd probably take that action after we got through, but he's not bound to that."

There isn't a process through which the athletes can appeal Sherrill's disciplinary action, Kibler said.

"It would be more whether Jackie Sherrill would feel that an appeal should be granted, in which case there are probably any number of forums that could handle that kind of an appeal," Kibler said. "But we don't have any process for that at this point."
