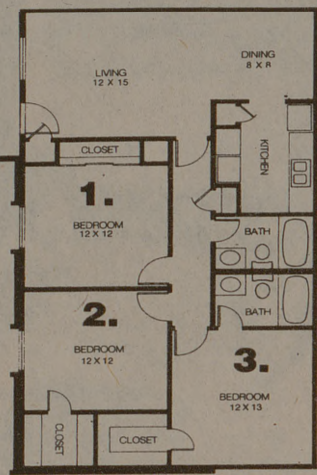

# Rockets lose again in 'Sampson derby'

**HOUSTON** — With Bill Walton healthy and ready to play fulltime for the San Diego Clippers, who needs Ralph Sampson?  
The Houston Rockets, that's who — if the Clippers' 105-97 win over the Rockets Tuesday night was any indication.  
Rockets' center Caldwell Jones scored one basket in 23 minutes due primarily to the defense played by Walton, who fought for 38 minutes without showing any ill effects of foot ailments that have dogged his career.  
Meanwhile, Clippers rookie forward Terry Cummings, guard Lionell Hollins and center Walton — a threesome the Rockets cannot match — combined to score 69 points. Cummings led with 31.  
San Diego, 9-27, surged four games ahead of the last-place Rockets, 5-30, in their drive for respectability.  
In contrast, the Rockets fell into their biggest lead of the season in their quest for the No. 1 draft choice they will use to obtain Sampson, a 7-foot-4 University of Virginia center.  
"Unfortunately for us, this puts us out of the Ralph Sampson derby," said Clippers veteran guard Randy Smith. "But that's good. This club is here to win. We have been off and on like the Rockets, but we've sure picked it up over the last few weeks."  
The Rockets' unstated campaign to finish last is allowing them to play youngsters over proven veterans, and that program received a lift in the loss when rookie guard Terry Teagle hit 16 of 34 shots en route to a 34-point game.  
Teagle's and rookie Brad Taylor's defense in a mid-court trap seldom used by Coach Del Harris ignited the Rockets early through the final quarter, allowing them to score 14 straight points and pull within four points of the lead.  
An angry shoving and punching match between Rockets

forward James Bailey and Walton also woke up the Rockets, Harris said.  
Walton, whose elbow to Bailey's face during play started the incident, caught the worst of it when Bailey slugged him and caused his plastic glasses to scrape the left side of his face and neck.  
He refused to discuss it, and Bailey left the locker room before the end of the game after having been ejected for throwing a punch.  
"The official (John Vanek) said James hit Walton unprovoked," Harris said. "But the Rockets' version is that James was elbowed. I don't imagine the elbow was intentional."  
The Clippers, who led comfortably through most of the game, disintegrated early in the fourth quarter but then got 7 points from Hollins in the final six minutes to rally. Hollins, Cummings and Walton scored all the Clippers' points in that period.  
The key, to Harris, was Hollins' coolness under pressure.  
"He's ice to Coca Cola," the opposing coach said. "Without him they didn't have a legitimate leader on the court."

The Clippers may score another in Walton, who cated when he finishes school semester this week try to rejoin the team. (He has been playing one week. This week he has more.)

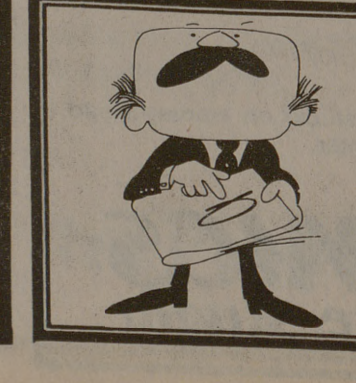
