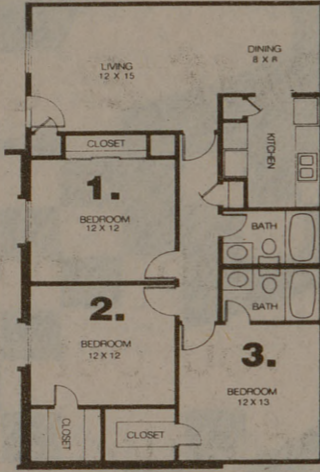

Solar project loses funding

United Press International LUBBOCK — Despite what project directors call "magnificent" results, the multi-million dollar Crosbyton Solar Power Project has lost its federal funding.

"Tests at the site have proved the concept has validity as an alternative source of energy," said Dr. Knox Jones, vice president for Research and Graduate Studies at Texas Tech University. "In fact, the Crosbyton Project has done magnificently."

The loss of funding forced a shutdown of the entire system last Friday.

But Jones stressed that the loss of federal funding was "only a short interruption in the project," which was being funded by the Department of Energy.

"The project is good," said Dr. John Reichert, project director. "Many in the federal government have given it support and indicate to us that funding will become available to proceed."

The eight-year-old project was the first system of its kind to be built. It was also the first to achieve maximum theoretical performance of generating electricity from the sun.

Gulf Oil to end credit surcharges

United Press International AUSTIN — Texaco dealers and consumers will see about \$10 million a year because of Gulf Oil Corporation's decision to end its surcharge to dealers for credit card purchases, the state Oil Marketers Association says.

Gulf Refining and Marketing Company, the firm's retail arm, announced Friday the three percent surcharge will be discontinued effective yesterday hoping to make the oil company more competitive.

Bill H. Bailey Jr., president of the Austin-based association that represents 850 companies that own, supply or operate service stations, praised Gulf's decision.

"We are pleased to see that the company has recognized the detrimental impact the surcharge had on the distributors, dealers and consumers they serve," he said.

Bailey said refiners began the surcharges last year to raise profits, but he said it costs the average marketer \$45,000 a year. Larger distributors were paying nearly \$1 million a year.

TOMA estimated surcharges by Texaco, Exxon, Amoco, Phillips, Mobil, Conoco, Chevron, Gulf, Chevron and McGee is costing Texas motorists more than \$50 million annually.

Gulf's decision may have been a response to Shell's plan to honor all credit cards through their outlets, said Bailey. Shell has reportedly signed more than one million new credit accounts since implementing the program in late 1981.
