## Capitol view topic of bill

United Press International AUSTIN, — Sen. Lloyd Dog-gett, D-Austin, Monday introduced a bill that would block the construction of state buildings that would obstruct the view of the state Capitol.

"People coming for this year's inauguration will still be able to see the Capitol dome, and I think it's important that we take steps to make sure that will be true for future inaugurations,"

Doggett said. The bill would assure that the view of the Capitol from three specific locations — the steps of the University of Texas Main Building, the LBJ Library and Waterloo Park — be unob-

Doggett noted that construction of the Texas Employment Commission building surprised Austinites and visitors by blocking the view of the Capitol from Symphony Square.

Texans from all over the state, and particularly those of us who live in Austin, have grown increasingly concerned that the Capitol not be boxed in from public view," he said.


