NRC clears HL&P report

HOUSTON — The Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff report made public Monday exonerates Houston Lighting & Power Co. of complaints it mishandled a controversial report on the South Texas Nuclear Project.

A 500-page NRC staff report said HL&P and its new design engineer, Bechtel Power Corp., have "adequately resolved or dispositioned" all construction and engineering questions raised by Quadrex.

"All items (in the report) important to plant safety had received adequate and timely attention," the NRC report said.

The study by a California based consulting firm hired by HL&P said Brown & Root Inc. engineering design work on the \$5.5 billion plant — much of which was done as the project was being built — was inept.

A few months after receiving the report, HL&P fired Brown & Root.

Critics complained HL&P did not supply the NRC complete copies of the report until several weeks after receiving it and charged HL&P was trying to hide the report.

But the NRC concluded HL&P was not required to submit the entire report because engineering design was completed by Quadrex had been into construction.

"They are saying we did the report properly," spokesman Don Bechtel said. "It's pretty spectacular that HL&P had that judgment on its side."

Project critic Larry San Antonio said the NRC report of HL&P's handling of the report was no surprise.

"The NRC is funding and terminally corrupt," he said. "They're doing a good job of protecting the nuclear industry."

A 13-member NRC investigative team said it found deficiencies turned up by the report that HL&P had failed to disclose to the NRC. HL&P had three deficiencies in computer codes and air-conditioning system.

A hearing before a licensing board, in next June, is expected to be in about four months. Whether the Quadrex findings will be whether HL&P tried to withhold them from the NRC.

'Spanglish' held language threat

EL PASO — Officials in the Mexican government are so worried about "Spanglish," a combination of Spanish and English used along the U.S. border, that they want a special commission established to keep the language pure.

Former President of Mexico Jose Lopez Portillo ordered the creation of a Committee for the Defense of Culture and Language to guard against the slang — which the committee sees as the debasement of the mother tongue — in publications and public places.

"Even though I'm a newspaper editor and should speak grammatical Spanish all the time, I find myself constantly using some of the 'Spanglish,'" said Gaston de Bayona, a writer, editor and language teacher from Juarez, Mexico.

"It's a pop thing to say things like 'muy nais (very nice), muy Star Wars (up to date), muy money (expensive) or muy heavy,'" he said.

Dr. Ricardo Aguilar, an assistant professor of modern languages at the University of Texas at El Paso, agreed, saying "I don't think anything can be done (to stop the creation of 'Spanglish')."

"The structure of Spanish and Spanish that we speak in our brains are starting to mix together. They'll come together and mix more. There's no way to stop it, but that's what we have to do," he said.

Not all academicians think that a new language is being developed.

Dr. Mary Ellen Garcia, National Center for Mexican Research in Southern California, said a new dialect is being developed along the border, but she doesn't think it will be a totally different from Spanish.

"People feel they can say certain things better in Spanglish than the other," she said. "Things involving culture — school, newspapers, government require English, but on the other side of the same things involving the culture or home life require Spanglish."

Nevertheless, Aguilar is convinced that a new language will develop during the next few years.

"I know people say that current languages are dying, but that no new language can be created," Aguilar said. "But all, that's what they say about Latin."
