**USFL to help athletes get degree**

SAN ANTONIO — When it comes to offense, San Antonio is not bashful.  
The Spurs took 109 field goal

attempts, connected on 60 of them and ended the game with 143 points for their third straight NBA victory.

Gene Banks scored a career-high 30 points and grabbed 11 rebounds to lead the Spurs to a 143-124 victory over the Denver Nuggets.

"When I was at Cleveland I think we scored that many at San Antonio," laughed Spurs' coach Stan Albeck, who explained Denver coach Doug Moe was at San Antonio during the time he coached at Cleveland.

"They (Nuggets) give you a lot of quick shot opportunities. Sometimes the best thing you can do is run back at them," Albeck said. "If you don't get in the groove against Denver, you're missing the game.

They're going to turn the ball over.

"Gene had another outstanding game. It's a shame he's not getting any recognition around the league. He's become an outstanding small forward."

Banks, who said he was aware of his milestone basket, added that the Spurs are putting things together this year.

"I heard the announcer when I tied my high (28)," he said. "Then I missed three or four. As soon as I hit that one, (the 30th), I was ready to come out.

"We're putting things together. We are a very confident and relaxed team. We are having a good time at practice and meetings. We are being cheerful in practice."

San Antonio outscored De-

nver 14-3, including 10 points in a row, to start the second half and take an 84-67 lead. The Nuggets never got closer than 13 in the second half and never led in the game.

The Spurs held a 70-64 half-time lead behind 17 points from Mike Mitchell, 16 from George Gervin and 14 from Banks. Dan Issel had 16 points and 10 rebounds in the first half for the Nuggets. He got no rebounds in the second half.

At least two of the Nuggets thought credit for the victory should go to Banks.

"Gene Banks is a real hard worker. He was allowed to push and shove a lot inside tonight," said Kiki Vanderweghe, who led Denver with 29 points.

Denver's Billy McKinney

agreed.

"I think Gene Banks got a lot of credit for the Spurs turning out to be a great player," McKinney said.

Mitchell had a total of 17 points for the Spurs, Gervin with 25, Artis Gilmore with 14, and Alex English and Dan Issel with 12 each for the Nuggets.

**Motta wins 600th as Dallas defeats Golden State 112-102**

OAKLAND, Calif. — Dallas Coach Dick Motta has won his 600th victory to become only the fifth NBA coach to reach the plateau.

The only other coaches to win 600 or more games are Red Auerbach, Red Holzman, Jack Ramsey and Gene Shue.

Motta's record game came at the expense of Golden State Tuesday night at the Oakland Coliseum, where his Mavericks came from behind to beat the Warriors 112-102.

"I knew it would come sooner or later," Motta said. "We played well in the second half which made it special for me. I still re-

member my first victory.

"It was the first NBA game I'd ever seen. With 19,000 people watching in Madison Square Garden we won by four."

Motta was referring to a 1968 victory registered by the Chicago Bulls, the first team he coached in the NBA. He later coached the Washington Bullets for four seasons before joining the Mavs in 1980.

Jay Vincent scored 12 points in the final quarter to lift Dallas.

"I had to be careful because of four fouls so I didn't force things," Vincent, who picked up 18 in the contest, said. "We made a good comeback because we cut down on our mistakes."

The Mavs committed nine turnovers in the first quarter but only 23 for the entire game.

Dallas trailed by 11 points in the first half but took the lead late in the third quarter on a basket by Jim Spanarkel.

Vincent and Pat Cummings then each hit a field goal in the first minute of the final period to give the Mavs an 85-77 lead.

The Warriors were unable to score in the first two minutes of the final period and made only one serious threat the rest of the way.

Golden State's Lester Conner made a field goal and free throw, and Larry Smith added a free throw to cut the Dallas lead

to 104-98 with 2:20 left.

Cummings then made two free throws to clinch the win.

Mark Aguirre paced the Mavs with 30 points while Short led the Warriors with 30 points. C

finished with 23.

"Cummings hurt us outside shooting," Golden State Coach Al Attles said.

Attles also said his team was hurt because Ron Brewer with the flu and J.B. Foule fouled out with six minutes left.

But, the coach said, "I'm not playing 48 minutes of ketball."

**Caps stop Flyers' win streak**

When they left, both streaks had ended in a decisive 4-1 triumph by the Capitals, who are now in the thick of the Patrick Division race. The Flyers, on top of the division, had to be content to share a road-record straight eight wins with five other teams.

"Anytime you win eight straight games on the road, you've got to be proud of your accomplishment," said Philadelphia Coach Bob McCammon.

"We just have to pick up our socks and go from here."
