Gretna bus driver shot

Authorities say a woman unhappy to find herself on the wrong bus cursed out the driver, pulled a .22 magnum from her purse and shot him to death as he guided the vehicle out into traffic.

Jefferson Parish sheriff's deputies called it a "totally senseless murder."
Witnesses said Suzie Stewart, 26, boarded the bus with her daughter just before noon Monday and got into an argument with the driver when he informed her of his route.

"He told her he didn't go that way," said Sherrel Marshall, one of 14 passengers who watched the incident in horror as the bus pulled away from the stop.

"She was arguing with him and he told her to get off the bus. He said 'You can get off anywhere, mam.' She said a lot of bad language and then she just started shooting."

The driver of the Marrero bound bus for Westside Transit was identified as Benjamin Forbes, 55.

After the shooting, the woman calmly shoved the pistol

back into her purse, took her daughter by the hand, left the bus and walked down the street. She was arrested less than a block away.

Stewart was being held at the

Jefferson Parish Correctional Center in Gretna. First degree murder charges were filed against her, said authorities, who placed the woman's daughter in the custody of the state.

Deputies said the shooting was especially bizarre in light of the death of Forbes' wife three years ago. She was gunned down by robbers at a city record store in which she worked.

Rogers, who has won 14 American Music Award trophies in the last decade, was honored as favorite country male vocalist and for his top country single, "Love Will Turn You Around." Rogers also won a special award of merit for "his

rise to the pinnacle of the music industry."

Ex-Commodore Richie won top honors as favorite male soul vocalist and for his pop-rock single "Truly."

Barbara Mandrell was honored as the top female country singer for the third consecutive year.


John Cougar and Rick Springfield tied for favorite male pop-rock vocalist while Daryl Hall & John Oates were named favorite pop-rock group.



Olivia Newton-John accepted her favorite pop-rock female
