Galambos was editor of the papers of Dwight D. Eisenhower, and wrote "The Public Image of Big Business in America" and "Competition and Cooperation."

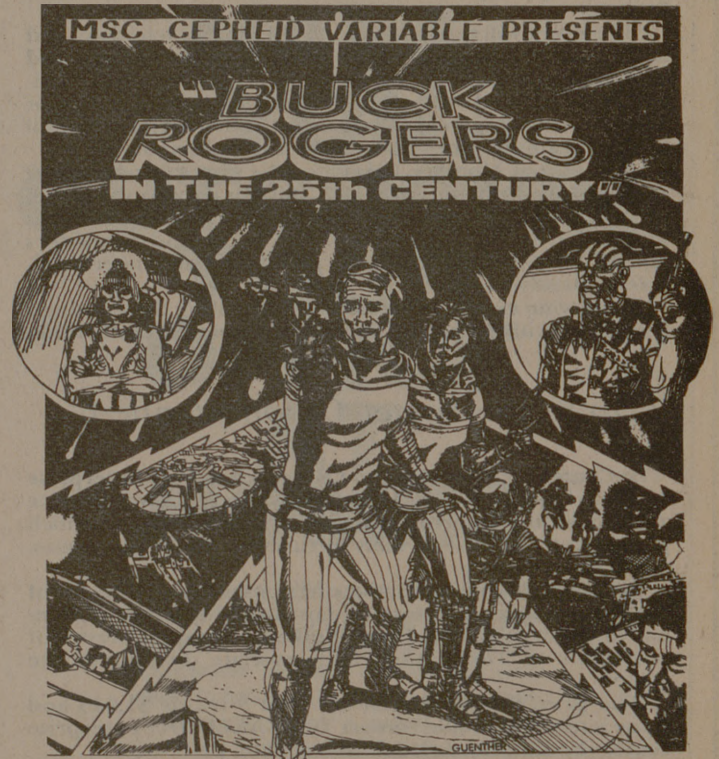
Council to study changes

The Academic Council will consider proposals for restructuring the council at its regular meeting at 3 p.m. today in 601 Rudder Tower.

Recommendations proposed by an internal committee include reducing council membership by eliminating elected members, redefining the functions and responsibilities of the council to focus on administrative matters and moving several standing committees from the Academic Council to the proposed faculty senate.

The Council also will discuss the establishment of a faculty senate. If established, the senate would consist only of elected faculty members and would absorb some of the Academic Council's duties.

The Academic Council would consist entirely of University administrators.

Big Event to blitz media

Prepare to be bombarded by publicity for the Big Event — the giant Student Government-sponsored volunteer project to be held Feb. 20.

The bombardment should begin Monday, with everything from messages on classroom chalkboards to 15-second public service announcements by Tom Landry and Eddie Chiles on local radio stations.

Joe Nussbaum, student government vice president of student services, said at a planning meeting Tuesday that Jackie Sherrill has agreed to do a television announcement.

The publicity campaign was made possible by recent contributions of \$1,000 from the MSC Student Programs fund and \$500 each from the Bryan City Council, the College Station City Council and the Bryan-College Station Chamber of Commerce. Nussbaum said that he had sent an invitation to President

Ronald Reagan, but had received a letter saying Reagan could not be here for the event. Former Dallas Cowboy quarterback Roger Staubach also had been asked, but had too many other engagements and the coordinators said they still are

trying to get someone famous to come.

Nussbaum said he recently received a letter from a group called ACTION in Washington, D.C., who along with the President give out 20 volunteer awards each year.

The letter included a nomination form for the Big Event, and, Nussbaum said with a grin,

winners get to eat lunch with Reagan in April — all 10,000, the number of people expected to participate in the Big Event.
