
The Academic Council will consider proposals for restructuring the council at its regular meeting at 3 p.m. today in 601 Rudder Tower.

Recommendations proposed by an internal committee include reducing council membership by eliminating elected members, redefining the func-tions and responsibilities of the council to focus on administrative matters and moving several standing committees from the Academic Council to the proposed faculty senate.

The Council also will discuss the establishment of a faculty senate. If established, the senate would consist only of elected faculty members and would absorb some of the Academic Council's duties.
