

Winning streak reaches 13

Sixers top Bulls, 126-106

According to Philadelphia Coach Billy Cunningham, all the victories by the 76ers during its club-record, 13-game winning streak have not been created equal.

"It has been quite a variation," Cunningham said. "There have been one-point games, overtime games and games we won easily. We've responded very well to each situation and that really pleases me."

The 76ers' 13th straight win, 126-106, over the Chicago Bulls Wednesday night, in Philadelphia, was an easy one. Julius Erving scored 26 points and Andrew Toney added 25.

In addition to setting a record

for the franchise, the 76ers built the NBA's longest winning streak of the season. They also have the league's best record at 33-5.

"Everybody is contributing and that's why we've been able to win so many in a row," Erving said. "(But) there are still some areas we would like to improve in."

The 76ers jumped to a 17-2 lead at the start of the game and twice led by 19 points in the first quarter. The closest Chicago came was 91-79 with 10:58 left, but Philadelphia then went on a 16-4 spurt to end the challenge.

In other games, Atlanta edged Seattle, 116-111, Detroit nipped Milwaukee, 107-106,

Kansas City trimmed New York, 91-88, Golden State slugged Utah, 103-95, Denver crushed Houston, 130-93, Phoenix topped San Antonio, 118-113, and Los Angeles nipped San Diego, 107-104.

HAWKS 116, SUPER-SONICS 111 — At Atlanta, Rory Sparrow scored 14 of his 25 points in the fourth quarter and Dominique Wilkins and Eddie Johnson each scored 24 to lead Atlanta. The Sonics have

now lost nine of their last 10 games.

PISTONS 107, BUCKS 106 — At Pontiac, Mich., Isiah Thomas' short jump shot with four seconds to play lifted Detroit after the Pistons were down by 5 points with 17 seconds left.

KINGS 91, KNICKS 88 — At Kansas City, Mo., Larry Drew scored 23 points, including two free throws with 25 seconds remaining, to help Kansas City snap a three-game losing streak.

WARRIORS 103, JAZZ 95 — At Salt Lake City, Michael Richardson scored 7 of his 29 points in the final 4:07 as Golden State outscored Utah 14-7 to clinch the victory.

NUGGETS 130, ROCKETS 93 — At Denver, Alex English scored 23 points and Denver coasted. Houston was led by Joe Bryant's 13 points.

SUNS 118, SPURS 113 — At Phoenix, Ariz., Maurice Lucas scored 30 points and grabbed 12 rebounds and Dennis Johnson added 26 points to lead Phoenix to its third straight victory.

LAKERS 107, CLIPPERS 104 — At Inglewood, Calif., Jamaal Wilkes scored 26 points, including a key basket with 30 seconds remaining, to pace Los Angeles. Terry Cummings led San Diego with 28 points.

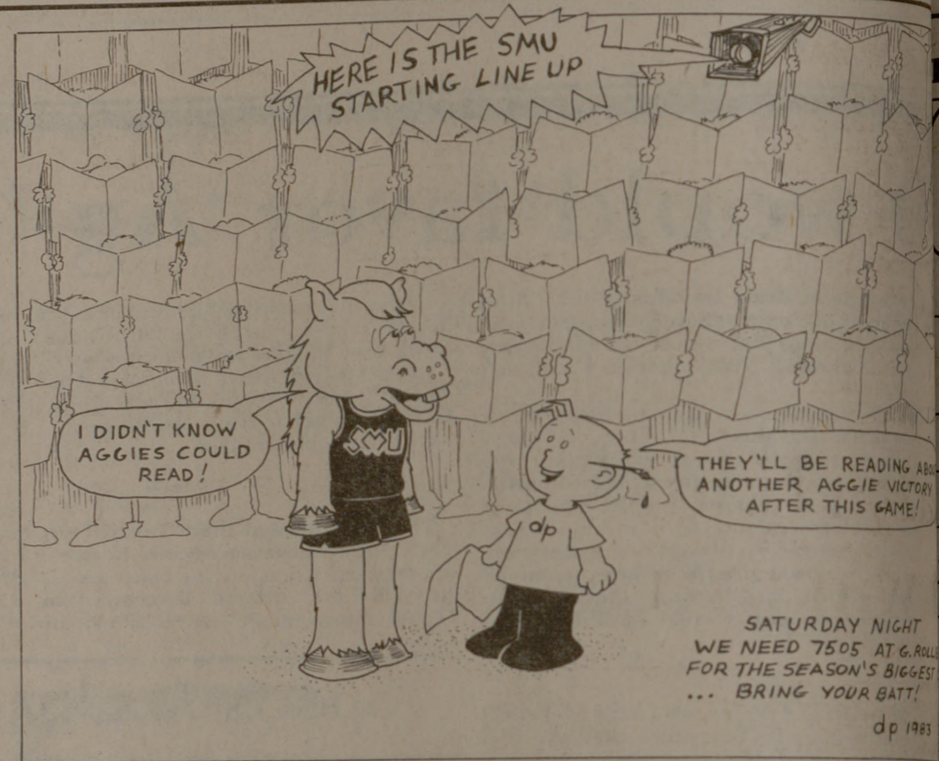
