NEW YORK — Five suspected members of the FALN have been ordered to stand trial

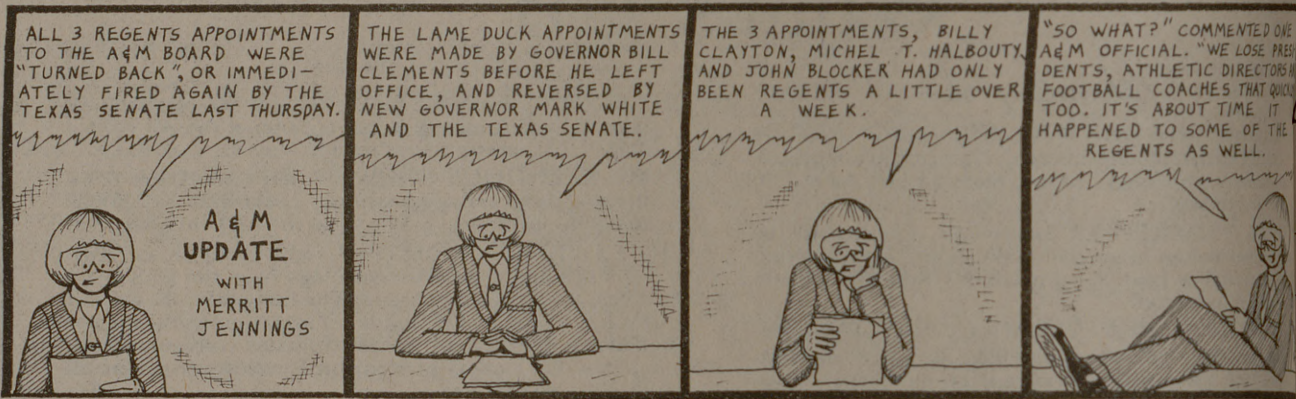
on contempt charges for their refusal to testify before a grand jury investigating the New Year's Eve terrorist bombings

Reagan to support anti-abortion bills

WASHINGTON — President Reagan, speaking on the 10th anniversary of the Supreme Court decision legalizing abortion, pledged Saturday to support legislation in the new Congress to "end the practice of abortion on demand."

Camp David, Md. "That's why I favor legislation to end the practice of abortion on demand and why I will continue to support it in the new Congress," he said.

said he also will press Congress to approve legislation protecting communities whether they want prayer in their schools or provide tuition tax credits for parents who send their children to private schools.

"Until someone can prove the unborn child is not a life, shouldn't we give it the benefit of the doubt and assume that it is?" Reagan asked in his weekly radio broadcast to the nation from the presidential retreat at

Noting that opponents of abortion were holding their annual march in the nation's capital Saturday, Reagan said, "I too have always believed that God's greatest gift is human life and that we have a duty to protect the life of an unborn child." Devoting his five-minute broadcast to the family, Reagan

Reagan carried with him his retreat in the Western land mountains the final address, which he will deliver before a joint session of Congress at 9 p.m. Wednesday. Aides predicted he would deliver the speech himself.

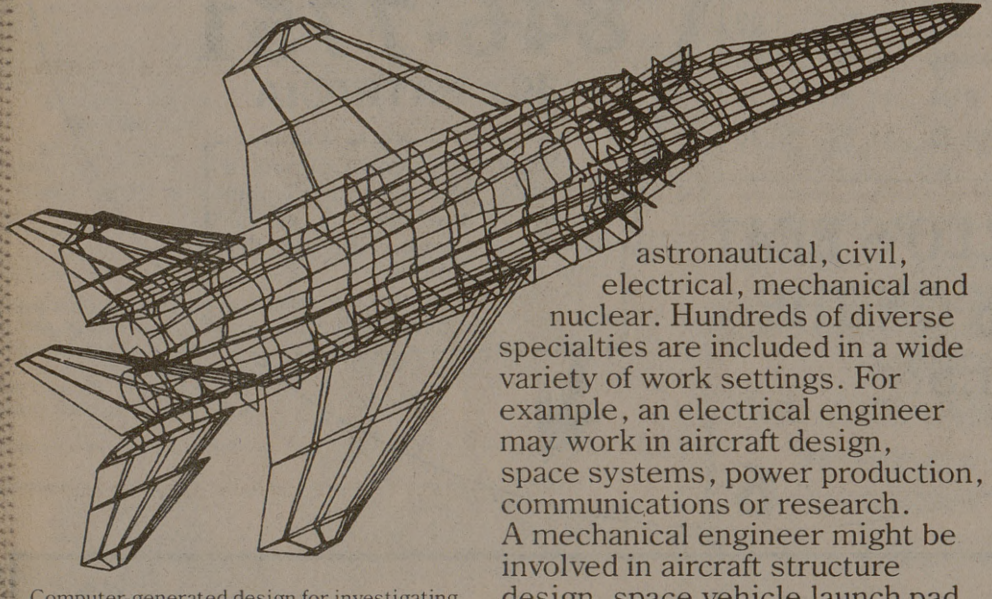

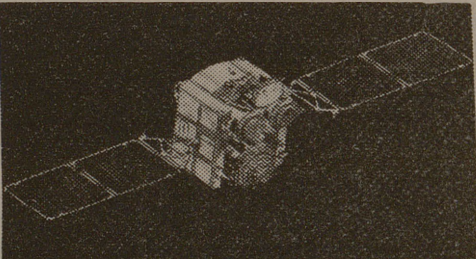

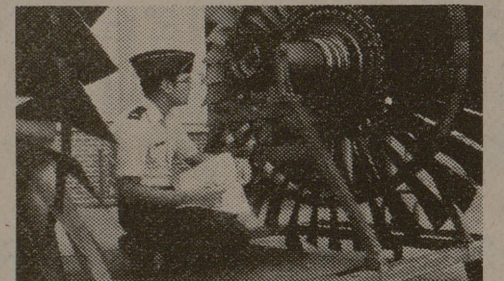
