Cadets may have had some influence on that response, but not much.  
"By the extent of their participation, they have a great deal of influence on student elections, but otherwise they probably don't have much effect," Luttbeg said.  
"If the campus is conservative, the Corps is the epitome of the conservative student. But they don't necessarily shape student opinion."  
Three out of four Corps members surveyed said they were conservative — compared to 53 percent for all students.  
While Corps members tended to be more conservative, women tended to be slightly more liberal, especially on the two military questions. Overall, 61 percent of the males questioned said they were conservative while only 45 percent of females questioned said they were conservative.

hometown size was between 100,000 and 1 million tended to be the most liberal with 27 percent saying they were liberal. Students who said their hometown size was more than 1 million tended to be as conservative as other students, with 57 percent saying they were conservative.  
Hometown size had some effect on political beliefs, with students from rural areas tending to be slightly more conservative. Students who said their

While hometown size and sex have some effect on political beliefs, Luttbeg said class tends to have little impact on them.  
"There's not much significance in class and political beliefs," he said. "Most data indicate that conservatives go to certain schools and liberals go to others. College experience usually has no impact on political beliefs."  
But even with the conservative responses on many questions, Texas A&M may be becoming slightly more liberal, at least on social issues. Luttbeg agreed, saying that the migration to Texas of people from other states and the increase in the number of women students, may be making the campus slightly more liberal.

"There has probably been some (change) with the growth of the University, probably increasing conservatism," Luttbeg said. "I wouldn't state a great deal of money on it, but..."

## Attorney says teacher-clients following rules

**United Press International HOUSTON** — An attorney for two school employees

charged with injury to a child for allegedly forcing a 9-year-old special education student to eat broccoli asked prosecutors to dismiss the charges on grounds his clients followed school guidelines during the incident.

The boy claimed the pair held his arms and legs and shoved his food in his mouth. The third grader was later treated for strained ligament in his right arm.

Lawyer Carol Vance, in a meeting with Harris County prosecutors, argued the misdemeanor charges should be dropped or referred to a grand jury because the employees followed widely practiced procedures for dealing with disturbed children.  
"I don't think all the evidence has been reviewed that should have been reviewed by the police department and the district attorney's office, before charges were filed," Vance said Friday.  
"If you took every charge that came through the door without a careful review, I think you would have a chaotic situation for teachers," Vance said.

Prosecutor Andy Tobias said his office would further investigate the case and may consider filing charges against two other school employees allegedly involved in the Jan. 12 incident.

School officials hired Vance, former Harris County District Attorney, to represent the women on the criminal charges. Officials said the employees followed district policy in disciplining the child.

## Former agent's trial opens today

**United Press International HOUSTON** — Former CIA agent Edwin Wilson, already sentenced to 15 years in prison on an arms smuggling conviction, goes on trial today on charges of exporting 20 tons of plastic explosives to Libyan terrorists in 1977.  
The second in a series of four trials accusing the former federal agent of various illegal dealings with terrorists was scheduled to begin amid allegations that Wilson plotted from his prison cell to hire hit squads to kill two federal prosecutors and five witnesses.  
CBS News reported federal authorities, in court papers

served on Wilson's attorney claimed the former CIA agent attempted to arrange the contract slayings of two U.S. Justice Department prosecutors involved in three upcoming trials against him and at least five other witnesses involved in the trials.  
The network said prosecutors planned to present evidence on the alleged assassination during Wilson's Houston trial. Jury selection in the trial was to begin at 1 p.m. Monday federal court.  
Assistant U.S. Attorney Jim Powers Saturday refused comment on the matter.  
Defense attorneys could not be reached for comment.
