Military blows up Pac Man



CARE's funds grow in spite of economy

CLAREMONT, Calif. — Despite an unemployment rate of

over 10 percent, and Depression-style "tent cities" springing up across America, CARE is pulling in more money than last year to aid the needy overseas,

the organization's executives The relief organization operated in 38 foreign countries with a \$350 million budget last year, but one CARE official said in an

interview that addressing domestic needs will become a topic of growing public concern.
"It's going to be more of an issue," said Mike Robitialle, director of CARE's Pacific South-

west Division.

"It's more of an issue now than it was a year ago," he said. "It's not an issue for CARE, but for the American people it will be an issue. Reople will say there is hunger in the United States

Americans donate the bulk of CARE's resources, and despite a severe recession and unemployment at its highest level since the Great Depression, they have increased their contributions.

"For the first six months of this fiscal year, we're running four percent above last year," Assistant Executive Director Ron Burkard said.

"It is a demonstration of the concern Americans have for people in other parts of the world. It may be bad here, but they think, 'What must it be like in Bangladesh?''


