member of the Committee for Awareness of Mexican-American Culture, said that most of the faculty are unbiased in their attitudes toward minority students.

The student said that the underrepresentation of Hispanic students is not the fault of the University.

"It's just culture, some (His-

panics) don't really care about a higher education," he said. "Those that do go to the University of Texas because they hear more about it."

Davis said that the attitude of minority students toward Texas A&M may keep some minority students from coming here.

"Minorities may feel it is too hard to cut the grade or that they stand out and feel that

something may be done against them," Davis said. "We need to get the idea out and across to minorities that Texas A&M is an equal opportunity school and let them know that everyone has an equal chance of getting a degree here."

Minority students also may feel alienated at Texas A&M, but that this feeling is usually initiated by the minority students,

Davis said.

"They come here to school where a minority majority and it's a shock," he said.

Davis said that minority representation has been increasing. At one time, the only minority students here were African American. Now, minority students are coming from all over the world.

of Student Affairs Jan Winiford. "Alcohol does play a role in the different discipline cases we see coming through our offices."

Of the students surveyed here, 47.3 percent said they thought drinking was a slight problem on campus. About 22 percent said they thought it caused a somewhat serious

problem and about 20 percent said they thought it was not a problem at all.

The Chronicle of Higher Education study found that the percentage of students who drink alcoholic beverages has not changed during the last eight years. According to the Chronicle, the findings reinforce what many experts have claimed for several years — that

alcohol consumption is not on the rise, but that campus officials' awareness of the problem is increasing.

Winiford said that the student affairs office did not know if drinking had increased here because statistics have not been kept on drinking habits.

Does keeping alcoholic beverages off the Texas A&M campus keep students from drinking as much? Is there really any reason

to keep alcohol off the campus?

A majority — 78.6 percent — of the students in the A&M poll said they thought alcohol should not be allowed on-campus events. A majority — 17.4 percent — said it should be allowed at on-campus events; 2.8 percent said they didn't know. **Wednesday: Should alcohol be allowed in the band?**

Deep in the northwestern area of Egypt called the Qattara Depression, geologist Geoffrey Franks was hunting for oil. Instead, he found the remains of ancient whales.

Since vertebrate fossils had never been found in that part of Egypt, Franks called upon Southern Methodist University paleontologists for help. What they found was a cache of bones from all sorts of ancient sea and shore dwelling creatures, like

crocodiles, sawfish, large sharks, sea cows and primitive whales. And all these water-loving creatures were located in an area 200 miles south of the present Mediterranean Sea, 400 feet below sea level, and believed to be roughly 42 million years old.

Some of the fossils represented ancestral forms of animal life that exist today. The whales, known as zeuglodonts, are the "tie between land and sea mammals" from a time shortly after the modern whale's predecessor's moved back into the water, according to SMU expert Bob Slaughter.

Although the zeuglodonts were more than 50 feet long, their slender skulls made them look "a bit more like crocodiles than whales," he adds. And unlike a whale, these animals could turn their heads at the neck.
