Brazos Business

B-CS ideal for hi-tech business

Bryan-College Station is an ideal location for high-technology industry, a Westinghouse real estate executive said Wednesday at the 1983 Brazos Valley Economic Outlook Conference.

Nancy Haines, executive assistant to the vice-president in charge of real estate for Westinghouse, outlined the procedure used to determine the best location for new Westinghouse plants.

Westinghouse plant is between 300 and 1,000 persons. The plant will create about 400 jobs, Haines said. The working force at a Westinghouse plant cannot exceed 5 percent of the population, or 20 percent of the eligible work force.

In addition, potential plant sites must be at least 50 acres in size or five times larger than the plant floor area, whichever is larger. They should be located on or near a major highway; access to a railroad is desirable, but not required.

The community also must be able to provide adequate public utilities to support the plant, as well as have available housing of all sizes and types. Good living conditions and substantial training facilities also are needed.

One of the major reasons Bryan-College Station was chosen by Westinghouse is its proximity to Texas Tech, Haines said.

"We like to provide our employees with an opportunity to obtain advanced degrees in the field of engineering," Haines said. "The only drawback to the facility as far as Westinghouse is concerned is the lack of classes. That will be a concern for our employees who will be at work on the day."

"I want to see a man to family, this conference to update fishfarmers on the latest research, much of which is conducted at Texas A&M.

But some of those who were in attendance, such as David Gann, owner of the largest private trout farm in Colorado, also are looking for winter sales.

"In Colorado, recreational fishing takes place only 6 months out of the year, so I came down here to find a market for my trout," Gann said.

He said that even though trout are a cold-water fish, they cannot withstand the sub-zero temperatures of Colorado during the winter. But he said he hopes his trout will fare better in the somewhat mild winter climate of Texas.

While the sale of trout may seem a risky venture, growers say the outdoor farming is excellent.

Gann said: "The market is extremely vulnerable to weather. As a result of us in the business, we have a bright future."

Fish farmers meet

Few people have probably heard of an albino catfish or a black paddlefish, but these strange aquatic animals were on campus this week as part of the Texas Fish Farming Conference and Annual Convention of the Fish Farmers of Texas.

Fish farming—the raising of fish for private or commercial uses—has become increasingly popular since the 1960s says Ken Johnson, an Agriculture Extension Service agent and host of this year's convention.

"This year's session has been extremely successful because of a good turnout," Johnson said.

He estimated that around 250 farmers from 10 states were at the three-day conference that concludes today.

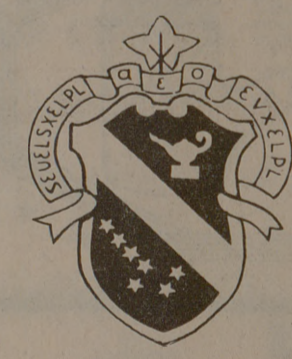
